2	not have been in the physical copy. I have the				
3	email submitting it.				
4	AGENT FLETCHER: Oh, let me take a				
5	look.				
6	MS. DUNN: Still on March 1st.				
7	AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. So it would				
8	have been just the last page missing? Let me				
9	make sure. So this is the last page?				
10	MS. DUNN: Yeah.				
11	AGENT FLETCHER: Let me make sure.				
12	Nope. Let me see. Yep, got it. Mr. Minora, do				
13	you want to take a look at this and see if you				
14	have this is the version that you have? Or				
15	you can keep this if you like.				
16	MR. MINORA: That would be great.				
17	AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.				
18	MR. MINORA: Just to be sure.				
19	AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, uh-huh.				
20	MR. MINORA: Thank you.				
21	AGENT FLETCHER: Ms. Dunn, there are				
22	eight people present from the group that you				

1 represent, which means that the Group of 12 is 2 granted --I believe it is 13 total. 3 MS. DUNN: 4 AGENT FLETCHER: Yeah, I'll get to 5 that, too. 6 MS. DUNN: Okay. AGENT FLETCHER: 7 Thank you. So there 8 is a Group of 12 granted full standing, which 9 means that at the upcoming Status Hearing, only 10 you need to appear as the designated 11 representative. So the group is granted to the --I'm going to grant standing to -- full standing 12 to the Group of 12. The -- in terms of the 13 14 University Club, that would have been the 13th 15 member of your group? 16 MS. DUNN: Yes. 17 AGENT FLETCHER: Yes? The University 18 Club filed a protest as a part of your group of 19 The University Club is a commercial property 13. 20 Is not a residential property owner. 21 It's a commercial property owner and it is not

abutting. And so that is what is unusual about

22

1 the University Club becoming a part of your Group 2 of 13. So what I'm going to do, I'm going to 3 4 grant conditional standing to the University 5 Club. I'm not going to dismiss the University 6 Club, I'm going to grant conditional standing to 7 the University Club. I'm going to allow the ABC 8 Board to take a look at granting standing to the 9 University Club as a part of your group. If I may be heard on that? 10 MS. DUNN: 11 The University Club owns the property on which it 12 is. 13 AGENT FLETCHER: They are not 14 abutting. 15 MS. DUNN: It does not have to be 16 abutting under DC Code 25 --17 AGENT FLETCHER: And that's the 18 argument that you will make. That's the argument 19 that you will make. 20 MS. DUNN: I understand, but you 21 referenced some -- there being something unique 22 about a commercial property owner and I have not

seen that language anywhere in the statutory --1 2 AGENT FLETCHER: That's okay. that will be the case you make. That will be the 3 4 case that you make. For today, I'm going to grant them 5 conditional standing. I'm not dismissing them. 6 7 MS. DUNN: Um-hum. But they are not 8 AGENT FLETCHER: 9 I understand what you are saying. abutting. know the regulations, how the regulations read. 10 11 MS. DUNN: Um-hum. 12 AGENT FLETCHER: But I'm going to 13 grant conditional standing to the University Club to allow the ABC Board to decide if it will grant 14 full standing to the University Club, even though 15 16 it is not an abutting property owner, only 17 because it does not abut. To see if they will 18 grant full standing to the University Club, even 19 though it does not abut. 20 MS. DUNN: Um-hum. 21 AGENT FLETCHER: And it is a

commercial property owner.

1 MS. DUNN: Um-hum. 2 AGENT FLETCHER: You'll make the case that you make. 3 Mr. Minora, did you have any -- that's 4 5 all? Okay. Thank you. And so, Ms. Dunn, we will proceed as 6 we normally would. They weren't dismissed, so 7 8 I'm going to set the date for mediation, a Status 9 Hearing and a Protest Hearing. And so you will still be representing 10 the University Club at the mediation, which 11 12 generally will take place before the Status 13 Hearing. So we can just move forward. 14 MS. DUNN: Okay. 15 I'm going to give you AGENT FLETCHER: 16 the dates for a Status Hearing and a Protest 17 Hearing first and then we will set the date for 18 the mediation. 19 The date for the Status Hearing is 20 April 10, April 10 at 9:30 a.m. The Protest 21 Hearing is set for May 15, May 15 at 1:30 p.m. 22 I'm going to give you the next
