AGENT FLETCHER: Would the parties in the matter of Midtown Center Restaurant, please, come forward? The parties in the matter of Midtown Center Restaurant. This is Case No. 19-PRO-00013, 1100 15th Street, N.W., License No. ABRA-112211. This is a Retailer Class CR new application.

The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order and quiet; residential parking; and vehicular and pedestrian safety.

My name is LaVerne Fletcher conducting the Roll Call Hearing as the Board's Agent.

Introductions beginning with the applicant, please.

MR. MINORA: Good morning. Mat thew Minora from the Law Firm of Mallios \& $0^{\prime}$ Brien, I'm licensed counsel for the applicant.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr. Minora. And your name, sir?

MR. HOLDER: Paul Holder, applicant.

AGENT FLETCHER: What's the first name again?

MR. HOLDER: Paul.
AGENT FLETCHER: P-A-U-L? And what's the last name?

MR. HOLDER: Holder, H-O-L-D-E-R.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much. And present on behalf of the Group of $13 ?$

MS. DUNN: Laura Dunn, D-U-N-N.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you, Ms. Dunn. Are there any individuals from your group present with you today?

MS. DUNN: Yes, there are a few and would you like them to step forward?

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, just stand up right in front of the microphone and state your name, but don't move the microphone.

MS. DUNN: Sorry.
AGENT FLETCHER: Just state your name and spell it for the record.

MR. FASANO: Michael Fasano, $F$ as in Frank, A-S-A-N-O.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you.
MR. CONROY: David Conroy, C-O-N-R-OY.

AGENT FLETCHER: C-O-N-R-O-Y?
MR. CONROY: Yes, ma'am.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much, Mr. Conroy.

MR. FOYNES: Desmond Foynes, 1026 16th Street, The Presidential.

AGENT FLETCHER: Desmond, how do you spell your last name?

MR. FOYNES: $F$ as in Frank, $\mathrm{F}-\mathrm{O}-\mathrm{Y}-\mathrm{N}-\mathrm{E}-$ S.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much.
MR. FASANO: I think we have a couple more.

AGENT FLETCHER: Good morning.
MS. ESCOBAR: Ana Escobar.
AGENT FLETCHER: Escobar is the last name?
the first name?
MS. ESCOBAR: Ana, A-N-A.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much. Thank you.

MR. THUMANN: Henry Thumann, T-H-U-M-A-N-N.

AGENT FLETCHER: Oh, T-H-U?
MR. THUMANN: $\mathrm{M}-\mathrm{A}-\mathrm{N}-\mathrm{N}$.
AGENT FLETCHER: M-A-N-N. Thank you. Good morning.

MR. LIVINGSTON: Gill Livingston.
AGENT FLETCHER: G-I-L?
MR. LIVINGSTON: Two Ls.
AGENT FLETCHER: Two Ls. Livingston?
MR. LIVINGSTON: Livingston.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you.
MR. LAMB: Doug Lamb.
AGENT FLETCHER: L-A-M-B?
MR. LAMB: L-A-M-B, yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr. Lamb.
MS. ANDERSON: Carolyn Anderson.
AGENT FLETCHER: I'm sorry, what was
that? What's the first name? I'm sorry, I missed it.

MS. ANDERSON: Carolyn.
AGENT FLETCHER: Oh, Carolyn with a C?
MS. ANDERSON: Yes, and L-Y-N.
AGENT FLETCHER: And what's the last name Carolyn?

MS. ANDERSON: Anderson.
AGENT FLETCHER: Oh, Anderson. Okay.
Thank you.
There are eight individuals present from the group that you represent, Ms. Dunn, and each of them signed the Protest Letter?

MS. DUNN: Yes. And I do want to make sure that you have the full correct copy. I believe the Protest Letter that we submitted in person had page 5 missing, but I emailed that same day, March 1st.

AGENT FLETCHER: Let me make sure.
MS. DUNN: And provided the full --
AGENT FLETCHER: What changed about

MS. DUNN: Just the last page might not have been in the physical copy. I have the email submitting it.

AGENT FLETCHER: Oh, let me take a look.

MS. DUNN: Still on March 1st.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. So it would have been just the last page missing? Let me make sure. So this is the last page?

MS. DUNN: Yeah.
AGENT FLETCHER: Let me make sure. Nope. Let me see. Yep, got it. Mr. Minora, do you want to take a look at this and see if you have -- this is the version that you have? Or you can keep this if you like.

MR. MINORA: That would be great.
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. MINORA: Just to be sure.
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, uh-huh.
MR. MINORA: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: Ms. Dunn, there are eight people present from the group that you
represent, which means that the Group of 12 is granted --

MS. DUNN: I believe it is 13 total.
AGENT FLETCHER: Yeah, I'll get to that, too.

MS. DUNN: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you. So there is a Group of 12 granted full standing, which means that at the upcoming Status Hearing, only you need to appear as the designated representative. So the group is granted to the-I'm going to grant standing to -- full standing to the Group of 12 . The - - in terms of the University Club, that would have been the 13th member of your group?

MS. DUNN: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes? The University
Club filed a protest as a part of your group of 13. The University Club is a commercial property owner. Is not a residential property owner. It's a commercial property owner and it is not abutting. And so that is what is unusual about
the University Club becoming a part of your Group of 13 .

So what I'm going to do, I'm going to grant conditional standing to the University Club. I'm not going to dismiss the University Club, I'm going to grant conditional standing to the University Club. I'm going to allow the ABC Board to take a look at granting standing to the University Club as a part of your group.

MS. DUNN: If I may be heard on that? The University Club owns the property on which it is.

## AGENT FLETCHER: They are not

 abutting.MS. DUNN: It does not have to be abutting under DC Code 25 --

AGENT FLETCHER: And that's the argument that you will make. That's the argument that you will make.

MS. DUNN: I understand, but you referenced some -- there being something unique about a commercial property owner and I have not
seen that language anywhere in the statutory --
AGENT FLETCHER: That's okay. And that will be the case you make. That will be the case that you make.

For today, I'm going to grant them conditional standing. I'm not dismissing them.

MS. DUNN: Um-hum.
AGENT FLETCHER: But they are not abutting. I understand what you are saying. I know the regulations, how the regulations read.

MS. DUNN: Um-hum.
AGENT FLETCHER: But I'm going to grant conditional standing to the University Club to allow the ABC Board to decide if it will grant full standing to the University Club, even though it is not an abutting property owner, only because it does not abut. To see if they will grant full standing to the University Club, even though it does not abut.

MS. DUNN: Um-hum.
AGENT FLETCHER: And it is a commercial property owner.

MS. DUNN: Um-hum.
AGENT FLETCHER: You'll make the case that you make.

Mr. Minora, did you have any -- that's
all? Okay. Thank you.
And so, Ms. Dunn, we will proceed as we normally would. They weren't dismissed, so I'm going to set the date for mediation, a Status Hearing and a Protest Hearing.

And so you will still be representing the University Club at the mediation, which generally will take place before the Status Hearing. So we can just move forward.

MS. DUNN: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: I'm going to give you the dates for a Status Hearing and a Protest Hearing first and then we will set the date for the mediation.

The date for the Status Hearing is April 10, April 10 at 9:30 a.m. The Protest Hearing is set for May 15, May 15 at 1:30 p.m.

I'm going to give you the next
available date for mediation. The next available day is Tuesday, March 26. Tuesday, March 26 at 9:00, 10:00, 11:00, 1:00.

MR. MINORA: 11:00 or 1:00, please.
AGENT FLETCHER: Ms. Dunn, 11:00 or 1:00 work for you?

MS. DUNN: Either works.
AGENT FLETCHER: 1:00?
MS. DUNN: 1:00 is fine.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.
MR. MINORA: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: Um-hum. Mediation is set for 1:00 on Tuesday, March 26th. Any questions at all?

MS. DUNN: Not at this time.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you for coming.

MR. MINORA: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you. The Roll Call Hearing is concluded.
(Whereupon, the Roll Call Hearing was concluded at 10:13 a.m.)
