ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE

The Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Administration (ABCA) has reviewed its records and determined that A.B.C. Brothers, LLC, t/a Mood District (Respondent), has failed to renew its Retailer's Class B License No. ABRA-120471. Specifically, the Respondent failed to renew its license by September 30, 2023, the deadline for all Retailer's Class B licenses, despite being notified of the renewal date.

On November 1, 2023, the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board (Board) issued an Order to Cease and Desist 2023-593 against the Respondent, pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-829 (2001), for failure to renew its Retailer's Class B License. The Respondent did not respond to the Order to Cease and Desist.

It is hereby **ORDERED** on this 15th day of November 2023, that A.B.C. Brothers, LLC's License No. ABRA-120471 is **CANCELLED**. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the Respondent.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section II of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879- 1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
