CHAIR ANDERSON: Good morning everyone.

I would like to welcome you to the regular scheduled meeting of the District of Columbia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. Today is November 20, 2019.

I would like to introduce members of the Board with us today. To my far right is Ms. Rafi Crockett, and to my immediate right is Mr. Bobby Cato. To my far left is Ms. Rema
Wahabzadah and to my immediate left is Mr. James Short.

My name is Donovan Anderson, I'm the Chairman of the Board. We have five members in attendance today, so we do have a quorum for the conduct of business.

I'd like to mention three things

AGYEI: And good morning. I'm 20 Dorcas Agyei, I'm representing the protest group 21 of 11. I'm also the ANC Commissioner for that 22 area. 23 CHAIR ANDERSON: Good morning. Now, is 24 it just a group of five or more protesting or is

it also the ANC?

MS. AGYEI: It's -- we did initially 1 2 protest, but due to how we made the initial 3 letter, that was dismissed. So, I am representing the group. 4 5 CHAIR ANDERSON: Okay. No, I just wanted to clarify, since you said you were the 6 7 ANC Commissioner, whether or not it was both or 8 what. Okay. Are there any preliminary matters 9 that need to be addressed? MR. LEE: We had a mediation last week 10 11 and the mediator found out that there is no issue 12 to resolve the mediation. 13 CHAIR ANDERSON: I'm sorry, that 14 there's what? 15 MR. LEE: The mediator, yes, found out that we had no issue to resolve at mediation. 16 17 MS. AGYEI: In her opinion, so we are 18 going to move straight to the hearing. 19 CHAIR ANDERSON: Well, I mean, there is 20 always a possibility that folks can talk. 21 mean, I -- if we have to have a protest hearing, 22 this matter is scheduled for protest hearing on 23 January 15, 2020 --24 MS. AGYEI: Correct. 25 CHAIR ANDERSON: -- January 15.

position has always been, is that if you can 1 2 settle a matter, settle it through a settlement 3 agreement. And one of the reasons why I always 4 5 state that, this is your community. You live here, you know what it is you want for your 6 7 community, and none of us live in that, well, 8 yes, none of the Board Members live in this 9 particular area. 10 And so, but if we have to, if we need 11 to have a protest hearing for us to make 12 decisions, so be it. Okay? MS. AGYEI: Okay. 13 14 CHAIR ANDERSON: All right. So, this 15 matter is scheduled for a protest hearing on 16 January 15, 2020 at 1:30 p.m. All right. 17 now that we have scheduled -- have any of you 18 done a protest hearing before? 19 MS. AGYEI: No. 20 CHAIR ANDERSON: No? All right. 21 MS. AGYEI: I have not.

CHAIR ANDERSON: All right. Now, that we have scheduled this matter for a protest hearing, there are a few things that I would like to instruct you about, so that the protest

hearing is focused and addresses only those issues that are being protested.

You either have already received or will still be receiving an email from Imani Moreland that contains a copy of the protest information form, PIF, and a copy of the exhibit form.

Both parties are required to complete and submit the PIF and the exhibit form at least seven days before the date of the hearing. If we do not receive a copy of your forms seven days before the hearing, your application or your protest may be subject to dismissal. Likewise, these documents not only need to be submitted to ABRA, but to the opposing party as well.

Please note that these documents greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process, and keeping the parties on point during the hearing.

Also, each side will have 90 minutes to present their case. This includes all direct and cross examination of witnesses.

The Board does not intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to those issues that are being protested, nor will

the Board tolerate repetitive testimony. Anyone have any questions?

MS. AGYEI: No.

CHAIR ANDERSON: We thank you for your cooperation.

MS. AGYEI: Thank you.

CHAIR ANDERSON: If you have any questions at any time leading up to the protest hearing, please do not hesitate to contact AGC April Randall at 202-442-4353. Ms. Randall is here, she's an attorney for the Agency. If you do not understand about the protest process, give her a call, she'll provide you with instructions, both side, instructions of what needs to be done.

The most important thing that I stated this morning is seven days before the hearing, you need to exchange documents with each side sent to the Board. If we have a protest hearing and if these documents are not exchanged, you stand the possibility of the Board not listening to your protest hearing.

Just want to make sure. Again, talk to Ms. Randall if you don't understand the process and she will provide both sides with the guidance that you require. Okay?
