ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE

The Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) has reviewed its records and determined that Prince Hall Freemason and Eastern Star Charitable, t/a Prince Hall Freemason & Eastern Star Charter Foundation (Respondent), has failed to renew its Retailer's Class CX Multipurpose Facility License No. ABRA-026242. Specifically, the Respondent failed to renew its license by July 12, 2022, the extension deadline for all Retailer's Class CX Multipurpose Facility licenses, despite being notified of the renewal date.

On July 13, 2022, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) issued an Order to Cease and Desist against the Respondent, pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-829 (2001), for failure to renew its Retailer's Class CX Multipurpose Facility License. The Respondent did not respond to the Order to Cease and Desist.

It is hereby ORDERED on this 27th day of July 2022, that Prince Hall Freemason and Eastern Star Charitable's License No. ABRA-026242 is CANCELLED. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the Respondent.

Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thi1ty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Coult of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion.
