

ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE IN SAFEKEEPING

The Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) has reviewed its records and determined that Neighborhood Restaurant Group XVII, LLC, t/a Red Apron Burger Bar (Licensee), currently in Safekeeping, has failed to pay the safekeeping fee for his license.

On March 23, 2018, the ABRA's Licensing Division mailed a written notice to the Licensee notifying the Licensee that the safekeeping fee must be remitted within thirty (30) days of the date of the notice, or the license will be cancelled, pursuant to the District of Columbia Official Code § 25-791(c-1)(1). The Licensee failed to make the payment despite being notified by ABRA of the payment due date.

It is hereby **ORDERED** on this 16th day of May, 2018, that Neighborhood Restaurant Group XVII, LLC's License No. ABRA-090634 is **CANCELLED**. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the Licensee.



Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
