On February 21, 2018, the District of Columbia (Government) filed a Praecipe of Dismissal seeking dismissal of the charge set forth in the Notice to Show Cause filed against Salma, LLC, t/a Red Lounge Hookah (Respondent). *See* ABRA Show Cause File No. 17-CMP-00612.

The Government seeks to dismiss because the Respondent changed its Class from a Retailer's Class CR License to a Retailer's Class CT License. Specifically, on April 26, 2017, the Alcoholic Control Board (Board) approved the Respondent class change to a Retailer's Class CT License terminating its statutory obligation to file the quarterly statement that formed the basis of the charge listed in the Show Cause Notice.
