CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, everyone. I would like to welcome you to the regularly scheduled meeting of the District of Columbia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

Please note that today's hearings will be conducted in accordance with D.C. Official Code Section 2574(b), 2574 of the Open Meetings Act.

Today is March 20th, 2019. I would like to introduce Members of the Board with us today. To my far right is Mr. Bobby Cato. To my far left is Ms. Rema Wahabzadah. To her right is Mr. Mike Silverstein. And to my immediate left is Mr. James.

My name is Donovan Anderson, and I'm Chairman of the Board. We have five members in attendance today for the conduct of business. I would like to mention two things before we get started.

First of all, if you have any electronic devices, pagers, or such, please make

certain that they are turned off to avoid any interruption of the proceeding.

secondly, there is a piece of paper on each table. When you come forward, as your case is called, please take a seat at the table, and please sign in. This is to ensure the correct spelling of your name for the record.

Additionally, when you introduce yourself for the record, please spell your aloud for the court reporter.

I would note that the, excuse me, the approximate time is 9:38 a.m. And as one hears, there is a pounding. And that is actually in the garage. So, and we're on the fourth floor.

That's actually five floors below us that we have that pounding. So, I would ask that when you present that you need to speak, so you can speak about the pounding that's going on downstairs.

All right. Let's move to our Protest Hearing Status calendar. The first case in our Protest Hearing Status Calendar is Case number 19-PRO-00008, Residence, License number 112301.

6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,

8	MR. ENGELMANN: Hi. Glenn Engelmann,
9	on behalf of the DuPont Circle Citizens
10	Association.
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Say your name
12	again, sir.
13	MR. ENGELMANN: Glenn Engelmann.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
15	Mr. Engelmann.
16	MS. CUNNINGHAM: All right. Kari
17	Cunningham, Commissioner for ANC 2B.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
19	Ms. Cunningham.
20	MR. BLANCHARD: And Lyle Blanchard fo
21	a group of five protestents, five or more.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now you're,

1	this was a group of 19? Was this initially the
2	group of 19? Or is this
3	MR. BLANCHARD: Yes. But
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, yes, I
5	know. But all right. All right. Mr. Blanchard
6	
7	MR. BLANCHARD: Yes, sir.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
9	It's my understanding that for the group only
10	three people showed up at the group at the roll
11	call hearing.
12	MR. BLANCHARD: Correct.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So therefore,
14	we need to have two more bodies show up today.
15	Do you have two more bodies to show up?
16	MR. BLANCHARD: We have three more
17	bodies.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Where are the
19	bodies, sir?
20	MR. BLANCHARD: I'm going to call them
21	forward.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, they need

1	to come forward. All right.
2	MR. BLANCHARD: I'd like to call
3	Lillian Gaskin, Susan Lindahl, and Christopher
4	Charles.
5	PARTICIPANT: Please speak up into the
6	mic. We can't hear you.
7	MR. BLANCHARD: Sorry.
8	PARTICIPANT: Would you say your name
9	for the, into the microphone.
10	MS. GASKIN: Of course. I am Lillian
11	Gaskin, L-I-L-I-A-N, G-A-S-K-I-N.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning.
13	Ms. GASKIN: Good morning.
14	MR. BLANCHARD: Okay. Next. You need
15	to get up and
16	MS. LINDAHL: I'm Susan Lindahl.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I didn't hear
18	your last name, ma'am.
19	MS. LINDAHL: S-U-S-A-N, Lindahl, L-I-
20	N-D-A-H-L.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
22	Ms

1	MS. LINDAHL: 1325 18th Street,
2	Northwest.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
4	Ms. Lindahl.
5	MS. LINDAHL: Good morning.
6	MR. BLANCHARD: And last but not
7	least.
8	MR. CHARLES: I am Christopher
9	Charles, C-H-A-R-L-E-S, last name. 1325 18th
10	Street Northwest.
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
12	Mr. Charles. All right. Ms. Yohannes, are there
13	any preliminary matters that you have?
14	MS. YOHANNES: No. No preliminary.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That you need
16	to raise? No? Does any of the three protestents
17	have any preliminary matters that they want to
18	raise?
19	MR. BLANCHARD: Just a minor point,
20	Chairman. On the notice, the notice talks about
21	some endorsements. And those include
22	entertainment, cover charge, dancing, and a

summer garden.

And we've looked at the site, and the adjacent site, Luna Grill. Luna Grill's license has an endorsement for a sidewalk café. And the space immediately adjacent to the sidewalk café of Luna Grill is the proposed site of the outdoor area for Residents.

And so, we'd ask that the applicant amend its application to say summer, from summer garden to sidewalk café.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Ms.

Yohannes?

MS. YOHANNES: Our understanding is that it is private property, and it's summer garden. However, if it is a sidewalk café, and it's public space we will amend accordingly. However, we are seeking outdoor space.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right.

MS. YOHANNES: Outdoor space for existing --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, as you are aware, if it's public space, even if we were

to give the endorsement, then they would have to have the permit from --

MR. BLANCHARD: Right, right. I'd just like the record to reflect that it's going to be sidewalk café. I don't see it as a fatal flaw as far as the notice is concerned. And I'm not raising it in that context. I'm just raising it as an issue, so that when the license is approved, that it says the proper designation.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, I think if we go to a protest hearing, which I, if we go to a hearing, then I would hope that by that time that it will be clarified whether or not it's public or, the space that's being applied for, whether or not it's public or private space.

MR. BLANCHARD: That's fine.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

MS. YOHANNES: And just for the record, I want the record to reflect that the neighborhood, the ANC, DCCA, and everyone else is aware that we are seeking outdoor space, private or public.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I think it's 1 2 clear that it's outdoor. That, I think --I just want to --3 MS. YOHANNES: CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: It's clear. 4 Ι 5 just want, I think what I've been told is that the title of the outdoor space wasn't that it's a 6 7 summer garden, or whatever it is, whether or not 8 it's public or private, that that information be 9 brought before the, on the license. So, I'm fine 10 with that. And are there any other preliminary 11 issues? 12 MR. BLANCHARD: No. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I mean, do the 14 parties -- All right. So, pending no settlement agreement this matter then is scheduled for a 15 16 protest hearing on April 10th, at 1:30 p.m. Are the parties familiar with the 17 18 process, or you need me to read the hearing, the 19 information regarding the fact that -- Well, one 20 thing that I'll bring to your attention. 21 Seven days prior to the hearing each

side needs to, you need to exchange whatever

1 documents or witnesses that you're relying on. 2 And if those documents or witnesses are not disclosed, then unless there's a showing of good 3 4 cause why it has not been done, then we will 5 prevent you from moving forward. So, that's the part that I want to 6 7 make sure that both sides are aware, that that's 8 something that's very important to the Board. 9 So, this matter then, if not, if 10 you're unable to reach a settlement agreement, 11 and I've always, if, I've always endorsed having 12 a settlement agreement. Because this is your 13 neighborhood. 14 So, yes, it's an application for a new 15 So, if you guys can work it out to say 16 this is what we're going to do, the Board will 17 entertain that. If not, I will see you on April 18 10th at 1:30 p.m. for a Protest Hearing. All 19 right. Have a great day. Thank you. 20 (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter
