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The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street N.W., Washington, D.C., Ms. LaVerne Fletcher, Agent, presiding.

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AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Would the parties in the matter of Reverie, please, come forward? This is Case No. 17-PRO-00088, Spero, LLC, 3210 Grace Street, N.W., License No. ABRA108125. This is a Retailer Class CR new application.

The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order and quiet; residential parking; and vehicular and pedestrian safety; and real property values.

My name is LaVerne Fletcher. I'm conducting the Roll Call Hearing as the Board's Agent.

Introductions beginning with the Applicant, please?

MR. SPERO: Yes, Johnny Spero. The last name is S-P-E-R-O.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr. Spero.
MS. FETHERSTON: Angie Fetherston, F-E-T-H-E-R-S-T-O-N. first name? Did you say Angie?

MS. FETHERSTON: Angie, A-N-G-I-E.
AGENT FLETCHER: And that's F-E-T-H-ER?

MS. FETHERSTON: S-T-O-N.
AGENT FLETCHER: Fetherston?
MS. FETHERSTON: Yes, ma'am.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you. Mr.
Spero, would you put your contact information on that sheet, please?

MR. SPERO: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: Present on behalf of
ANC-2E?
MS. PALMER: Lisa Palmer.
AGENT FLETCHER: Lisa, would you spell your last name?

MS. PALMER: Sure. P-A-L-M-E-R.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much. And then there is a Group of 10 abutting property owners?

AGENT FLETCHER: And who is present on behalf of that group?

MS. DU TOIT: I am. My name is Esther Du Toit. My last name is $\mathrm{D}-\mathrm{U}$ space and then $\mathrm{T}-\mathrm{O}$ -I-T.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you, Ms. Du Toit. And Mr. -- and your name?

MR. ANDERSON: Carl Anderson.
AGENT FLETCHER: Carl with a c?
MR. ANDERSON: C-A-R-L.
AGENT FLETCHER: Anderson with an 0 ?
MR. ANDERSON: S-O-N.
AGENT FLETCHER: And okay. And, Mr. Anderson, you are a part of -- you are one of the abutting property owners?

MR. ANDERSON: I am.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. Ms. Du Toit, your residence also occupy the building at 3210 Grace Street, N.W.?

MS. DU TOIT: We do.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. So you all occupy the same building.

MS. DU TOIT: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. So I -- there is also a -- I have a protest -- you are the president of the Condo Association at 3210 Grace Street?

MS. DU TOIT: That's correct.
AGENT FLETCHER: And I see that the condo association also filed a protest?

MS. DU TOIT: Yes.

AGENT FLETCHER: The condo association does not have standing as a protestant, because condo associations do not have standing as a protestant, but $I$ will grant standing to your nine abutting property owners. Mr. Anderson? Oh, okay.

And, Ms. Du Toit, you are representing the Group of 9 abutting property owners?

MS. DU TOIT: I am.
AGENT FLETCHER: Are you -- you are representing the group?

MS. DU TOIT: I do.
AGENT FLETCHER: The Protest Letters
that the group of abutting property owners submitted, it does say that "It is respectfully requested that if I cannot make it to the Roll Call Hearing, that a designated representative from 3210 Grace Street, N.W., represent my opposition herein."

So I'm going to accept that as you representing the group.

MS. DU TOIT: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: So a name was not stated, but it's clear that it can be you and I will accept you as the designated representative.

There are two protestants, ANC-2E and the Group of 9 abutting property owners.

The board of directors of the condo association does not have standing and is dismissed as a protestant.

We need to set a date for a mediation, Status Hearing and a Protest Hearing. I'll give you the date for the Status and Protest Hearing first.

The day of the Status Hearing is

January 31st. That's January 31st at 9:30 a.m. The Protest Hearing is February 14 at 4:30 p.m. February 14.

Are you available for mediation on January 17 at 11:30 or 1:00? That's a Wednesday. MS. PALMER: I could do 11:30. I cannot do 1:00.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Would that work for you, Ms. Du Toit?

MS. DU TOIT: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: And for the Applicant as well?
(No audible answer.)
AGENT FLETCHER: So that's Wednesday, January 17 at 11:30.

MS. PALMER: Is there any possibility to do it earlier in the day or no?

AGENT FLETCHER: We can do it earlier. We can do it at -- actually, $I$ have something else pending. What about 10:00?

MS. PALMER: That would be better for me. I don't know about anyone else.

AGENT FLETCHER: Would that work for everyone?

MS. PALMER: If you can't, I'll make it work. I can make 11:30 work if you need to. That's fine.

AGENT FLETCHER: Do you want to try 9:00?

MS. PALMER: $I$ just need to leave by around 12:30.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. So --
MS. PALMER: And I imagine what --
AGENT FLETCHER: -- yeah, if you need to leave, we can make sure you are done by 12:30.

MS. PALMER: That will be fine.
AGENT FLETCHER: What about we can do 11:00 and we can be done by 12:30.

MS. PALMER: Well, that's up to everybody else.

MS. DU TOIT: 11:00.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Is that good for you?

MS. PALMER: Right.

MS. FETHERSTON: That's fine.
MS. PALMER: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: So what did you say, 11:00? Ms. Du Toit?

MS. DU TOIT: Yes?
AGENT FLETCHER: 11:00?
MS. DU TOIT: 11:00 works. Thank you.
MS. PALMER: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: Mediation is set for Wednesday, January 17 at 11:00.

MS. FETHERSTON: I have a question.
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes?
MS. FETHERSTON: In the group of abutting residents in their Protest Letters, there were a couple that were doubles. Have those been counted towards the nine?

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. You mean they resided in the same unit?

MS. FETHERSTON: No. They submitted two letters under the same person. There is two or three examples of that.

AGENT FLETCHER: Oh, I eliminated all
the duplicates.
MS. FETHERSTON: Thanks.
AGENT FLETCHER: Yeah, they were duplicate letters. You may have gotten some duplicates. Yes, I eliminated all the duplicates. I did see those.

MS. FETHERSTON: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: You're welcome. And that was Ms. Fetherston speaking.

Any questions at all? Okay. Well, thank you for coming. See you --

MR. SPERO: Thank you.
MS. PALMER: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: -- at mediation.
(Whereupon, the Roll Call Hearing was concluded at 10:53 a.m.)
