ORDER GRANTING STANDING


In the matter of the Application for a New Retailer's Class CR License filed by Wyoming Cube & Bale, LLC, t/a Sandbox, the Citizens Association of Georgetown and multiple abutting property owners have requested automatic recognition of standing to protest the current application filed by Sandbox. The protestants were previously granted standing to protest Sandbox's prior application at the same address, which was withdrawn. *See Case No. 18-PRO-00061*. In light of the similarity of the issues and parties in this matter, the Board finds that the Applicant has been provided sufficient notice of the issues under contention under Title 25 of the

D.C. Official Code. Moreover, the Board finds that the request for standing submitted by the protestants satisfies all procedural requirements required to protest the current application.


ORDER



Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, Reeves Center, 2000 14th Street, NW, 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Code § 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001. However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1719.1 stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. *See* D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
