one of the reasons why we have this Fact-Finding
Hearing is because the Chief of Police has made a
request to the Board to bring in the owner and to
-- because he thought it was of concern and so,
therefore, we are trying to ascertain where we
are and whether or not the Board should just have
a Fact-Finding or whether or not we should have
any further investigation on this matter.

So I'll start off with Mr. Puente.

Maybe you can just bring us up to speed on what
the incident was.

INVESTIGATOR PUENTE: Yes. So on Sunday morning, October 28, 2018, there was an altercation inside of Secret Lounge. MPD units responded to the location. Upon arrival, the suspect was engaged in a fight with an unknown individual.

Officer O'Shea and some other officers attempted to break up the fight. During that time, Officer O'Shea was struck by the suspect and assaulted. He was placed under arrest for simple assault on a police officer.

Later that morning, I was walking down 1 2 9th Street and was flagged down by the Nightlife officers over there who advised me of the 3 I made contact with Mr. Daneale about 4 incident. 5 the incident. He showed me surveillance video There was a fight upstairs that 6 right away. 7 broke out among patrons. At that time, security tried to break up the fight. They were having a 8 9 hard time, so they went outside and got MPD 10 officers.

MPD officers came in and once they got the suspect outside, he engaged with MPD outside. During that same time, I was forwarded video from social media Instagram. There was a patron that picked up a table and assaulted another patron with that table.

On the video that I obtained, you could see it in the background the patron assaulting another patron with the table.

I advised Mr. Daneale that this was the second or third incident and he needed to take steps to try to mitigate these issues. He

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advised me that he was going to begin the RDO officers to assist.

As far as I know since October when I met with him, he has been with RDO, been getting RDO officers. And since then, there haven't been any issues with the establishment. ABRA hasn't been called or notified about any other issues since.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. So as a result of your investigation, were there any ABRA violations that you were aware of?

INVESTIGATOR PUENTE: No. The establishment does not have a security plan or a settlement agreement.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And was the -- how cooperative was the owner?

INVESTIGATOR PUENTE: Very

cooperative. He asked for recommendations. I

advised him to look at his security to see if he

needed to hire more/additional security guards,

depending on the type of event or crowd they were

going to have. The establishment is mainly

second floor. It's very small. So once he reaches his occupancy, he shuts it, one in/one out. He is very good about that.

and many of the patrons outside get upset because they can't get in and security tells them they can't get in until the people come out, because he does not go over his occupancy. And that was a lot of the issues before October of people were getting upset, they wanted to go in, so that's why I advised him to look at getting RDO detail. That RDO can be out front. They can -- if you need them, they will be there and they can assist with the crowd out front and tell them to move along or keep them moving.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So I know you said you had made recommendations to him, so what night of the week was this?

INVESTIGATOR PUENTE: This was a Saturday night into Sunday morning.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So in your view, when is it that -- are you familiar with

1	this establishment?
2	INVESTIGATOR PUENTE: Yes.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So when is it
4	that you believe, at least in your view, that
5	there is a lot of activity?
6	INVESTIGATOR PUENTE: Probably the
7	weekends, Friday and Saturday nights.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good afternoon,
9	Officer O'Shea.
10	OFFICER O'SHEA: Good afternoon, sir.
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is there
12	anything you want to add to what happened this
13	night?
14	OFFICER O'SHEA: Well, if you don't
15	have any specific questions, sir, I could
16	certainly am happy to give you my recollection of
17	events.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right. It's
19	nothing specific, it's just whatever you
20	recollect, sir.
21	OFFICER O'SHEA: Certainly. We
22	responded that night when we were flagged down

for a fight inside. I can't describe it, you know, in any better way than saying it was complete pandemonium in there, which is, unfortunately, in my opinion and experience, not uncommon.

I went up the stairs. It was dark. Again, it was poorly lit, but I would estimate that there were 15 to 20 people actively assaulting one another. At that point, with about three other officers, we called for additional officers, attempted to break up the melee.

The defendant who was arrested struck me while I attempted to pull him off another individual and the result of which sent me threw a table that broke. I was able to get him under control and bring him outside where he continued to resist. And again in my experience, it's not uncommon to deal with assaults and disorderlies in the immediate vicinity of that establishment.

The RDO officers had been in place, I believe, for several months. I don't think it

has been since October. I think it has been probably closer to about 45 days or so on the weekends.

I can't tell you with any great accuracy what events or incidents we responded to in that time. I would have to go back and look and, obviously, I don't work every night. But I would call it a problem block. I would call it a problem establishment.

In August, we had a homicide right outside and I was on that scene and to my recollection, there were lots of folks who were likely patrons of the lounge that night immediately outside. The place is a problem.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So what recommendations, if any, could you make to the ABC Board? What, if anything, that -- and this is just a Fact-Finding Hearing. We are just -- we can't order them to do anything. We can kind of nudge them, but just as a general proposition, is there any recommendation that you would make to the Board, so at least when I address the

owner to see what can be done to improve the 1 2 situation? OFFICER O'SHEA: I wish that I did 3 4 have recommendations. I'm not a subject matter 5 expert on what your limitations and your --6 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, based on 7 I know you stated that it was a what you see. problem. You said that the RDO might have 8 9 helped, but are there any, just from your --10 OFFICER O'SHEA: Well, anecdotally --11 sure, it's my personal opinion --12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yeah, that's 13 fine. 14 OFFICER O'SHEA: -- that they over-15 serve people. It's like, you know, they do it 16 frequently and without any ramifications and that 17 the end result of that is that people fight and 18 behave in, you know, what charitably can be 19 described as disorderly behavior and, you know, 20 presents a problem for people who live on the 21 block, are transiting the block.

It falls out, you know, it creeps

outside and, you know, I'm sure there are other issues that go on in there that we don't know about because it ends up being self-contained, but I think they habitually over-serve people.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Thank you. Ms. Yohannes, on behalf of your client, how does your client respond and what changes, if any, do they -- have they initiated or do they plan to or will do?

MS. YOHANNES: Sure. As you may recall, this licensee was before the Board in December for a separate Fact-Finding and in that matter, the Board made a decision to not take any further action. The licensee voluntarily submitted a security plan thereafter. They agreed to submit a security plan.

So right now, there is a security plan in place. At the time that this incident occurred, there was not a security plan in place.

And regarding, and I can speak to some of the statements that were just made as well as what is in the report, in the case report, it

does say that there was -- there are cameras in which they were only retaining footage for 15 days. Now as a result of the security plan, he is retaining footage for 30 days.

The operator also knows how to operate the security cameras and how to get footage if footage is requested.

Additionally, I would also like to point out what is in the report and what was also just stated by the Investigator. The licensee as well as his employees, staff were very cooperative. They gave over the footage when requested. They continue to cooperate.

Regarding the comment made about overserving people, there is no evidence. There is
no indication as to that in the report, in the
licensee's investigative history. He has never
been cited for that. I just wanted to make that
clear.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, the officer stated that was his personal opinion.

MS. YOHANNES: Sure.

I just want to correct the record. He did not state that this was in the report or that he saw it. He was just saying, in my, and he wasn't saying as an officer, personal opinion, this is what I think. And we all have our opinions that we can give.

MS. YOHANNES: Understood.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And I think
that, I would hope that the -- whether it's true
or not, that if someone has that impression, that
I would hope that the licensee takes that into
consideration in speaking to his bartenders in
the sense of keep track on that. All right.

MS. YOHANNES: And I will point out since October, there have not been any incidents. The staff as well as the security personnel are-have gone over the security plan. They know now procedurally what to do.

And he does also now have RDO officers, which at that time he didn't.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And when is or

1	when are RDO officers there?
2	MS. YOHANNES: On Fridays and
3	Saturdays.
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And from what
5	time to what time?
6	MS. YOHANNES: What time?
7	MR. DANEALE: 11:00 to 4:00.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: From what time?
9	MR. DANEALE: 11:00 to 4:00.
10	MS. YOHANNES: 11:00 p.m. to 4:00 a.m.
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: There are two
12	officers there?
13	MR. DANEALE: Yes.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So what
15	happened this night? I mean, what happened from
16	the owner's perspective? What happened?
17	MS. YOHANNES: Sure. So there was a
18	fight that occurred. There was it was on the
19	second floor, so a group of patrons started to
20	get rowdy and it started to escalate. The
21	security personnel that was on that floor noticed
22	that the incident, you know, noticed that a fight

may be occurring. They intervened, but soon thereafter it sort of got out of hand.

The two officers or two security
personnel began to escort women outside of the
establishment. And while they were doing that,
the men that were in that group started to fight
and there was also security personnel that
remained on the floor while the other two
security personnel were escorting people out.

So the other two tried to calm the situation and tried to separate the parties, that's when one of the security personnel on that floor went out to go call for MPD. And that's when MPD arrived and I think that's well, you know the rest.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, I know the officer talked about the lighting. I know that it is -- what type of establishment is this?

MEMBER SHORT: CT.

MS. YOHANNES: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So it's a tavern. So is there anything we can do about the

lighting? I don't know if it's poorly lit, so 1 2 I'm asking. 3 MS. YOHANNES: I don't believe it is 4 poorly lit. However, I think that the owner, and 5 he can speak to that, is willing to take that into consideration. 6 7 Do you want to talk about your lighting? 8 Do you think it is -- is there enough 9 lighting? 10 MR. DANEALE: There is enough light 11 there. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I mean, I guess 13 what I'm saying is that is it -- because it's not 14 a club, it's a tavern. So if I go into a tavern, 15 it probably should be like this. Well, it's a 16 tavern. 17 MS. YOHANNES: Right. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But some 19 taverns, restaurants kind of morph into, so we 20 set the mood for the lights. So that's why I'm 21 trying to find out what type of, based on the

establishment, lighting do we have?

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I'm just

1	asking.
2	MS. YOHANNES: I think
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: It's a
4	question.
5	MS. YOHANNES: Sure.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: It's just an
7	ask.
8	MS. YOHANNES: And at that time at
9	around 11:00 p.m. or later, I think on 9th and U,
10	the lighting is not like this. It's a little bit
11	dimmer. And so people are still visible within
12	the establishment. As the cameras show, you can
13	still see people. You can still see where
14	everyone is, but it's not bright lights.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Puente?
16	I'm sorry, are you done?
17	MS. YOHANNES: Yes.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do you have
19	have you experienced the lighting and do you have
20	any views? What's the lighting? If you don't
21	know, you can say you don't know.
22	INVESTIGATOR PUENTE: I want to go

back out and take a look at it again. I know it is dark. It's not bright, but I mean I'm sure some lighting adjustments could be made, especially on that stairwell when you are coming up the stairs. That's the main point entry for the second floor.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So Officer O'Shea, when you were talking about the light, were you talking about the lighting going up the stairs or the lighting in the club? What lighting were you talking about?

OFFICER O'SHEA: Sir, in my
experience, the lighting inside of Secret Lounge
is not consistent with the lighting you would
find in what you described as a tavern. It is
more consistent with a club and I would say the
same about the volume of the music.

I remember quite vividly having to scream over the radio for more units, because I couldn't hear myself. I couldn't hear the transmission on my radio as I was approaching about 20 males fighting, throwing chairs at one

another. So I think it is disingenuous to suggest that the atmosphere inside of that establishment is not like a club.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. We can only -- their license type is a tavern and so we know that certain taverns, they have some noise. Certain restaurants also. You also have restaurants who when it gets a little bit darker, that the cliental kind of changes and they kind of morph somehow. But I hear you, I hear you.

Any questions by any Board Members?
Yes, Mr. Short?

MEMBER SHORT: This is for the owner.

On your stairways, are you familiar with the

Building Code for establishments for public

assembly? What is your occupancy load? What is

your occupancy number?

MR. DANEALE: It's 199.

MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Anything over 50 is considered public assembly. And lighting on stairways is required by the Code Book and I'm quite sure if our Investigator would ask the Fire

Marshal to come out with him, that if you cannot see because that are stairwell light that you can add to the point of your second floor, where you can put on the side of the stairs themselves, because if it's that dark, somebody is going to fall and hurt themselves and you can get sued.

And so I would suggest to you that you either go to the Building Code or call someone that knows about lighting for places of public assembly. I'm quite sure our Investigator would help you out with that, because even though you are a tavern, places of public assembly must have lighting on the stairways.

Do you have cameras on the stairways?

MR. DANEALE: Yeah. We should have
the camera show you the stairway really light.

We have two lights all the way down to the
stairway and then we have a big light to the
stairway.

MEMBER SHORT: Do you have cameras on the stairway?

MR. DANEALE: Yes.

1	MEMBER SHORT: So you could see
2	someone's face in the camera?
3	MR. DANEALE: Everything you can see.
4	Very light in the stairway. I can't he can
5	send the Investigator tonight, he can see. All
6	the time you have light in the stairway.
7	MEMBER SHORT: Okay. I'm going to ask
8	our Investigator if he will go back out there.
9	MR. DANEALE: Yes.
10	MEMBER SHORT: And he can follow-up
11	and give us a report on that.
12	MR. DANEALE: Yes, please.
13	MEMBER SHORT: And also, how often do
14	you have fights in your club?
15	MR. DANEALE: This is the second
16	incident, you know, to happen since, you know, I
17	changed the audio and I change my security plan
18	and to train all the security. This never
19	happened that was any issue.
20	MEMBER SHORT: Okay. One other issue,
21	and I can tell you that because I know a little
22	bit about public safety

	MR. DANEALE: Okay.
2	MEMBER SHORT: whenever there is an
3	incident in your club, you are supposed to cut
4	the music down and the lights up, that's supposed
5	to happen automatic, that police officer
6	shouldn't have to yell on his radio. If you have
7	got a fight going on, you should that kind of
8	all your lights go up. Your music goes off.
9	That police officer and anybody coming in to help
LO	you out will help you get your club back under
L1	control and can do it better with that situation.
L2	So can you agree to do that?
L3	MR. DANEALE: Yes, yes.
L4	MEMBER SHORT: I mean
L5	MR. DANEALE: Yes, I do, but I don't
L6	know how you the officer explained that. When
L7	he was there, with talking
L8	MEMBER SHORT: Okay. I don't want you
L9	to get in an argument with the officer.
20	MR. DANEALE: Okay.
21	MEMBER SHORT: That's not a good
22	thing, but I'll simply say this to you. Him

getting assaulted in your establishment is not a 1 2 good thing. 3 MR. DANEALE: Okay. 4 MEMBER SHORT: I, as a Board Member, 5 I can't speak for the other Board Members, take that -- any of our officers or any Investigators 6 that go there, they should -- when they come in, 7 you should give them all the attention in the 8 9 world. They can help you and they can help us 10 keep you with a good license. 11 MR. DANEALE: Okay. 12 MEMBER SHORT: Okay? So if you agree 13 to do certain things and I guess a lot of things 14 have been answered. 15 MR. DANEALE: yes. 16 MEMBER SHORT: I don't have no more 17 further questions, but the RDO is working pretty 18 good for you? 19 MR. DANEALE: Yes. 20 MEMBER SHORT: No more incidents? 21 MR. DANEALE: Nothing. 22 MEMBER SHORT: All right. I want to

thank the Officer for coming today and thank you for the excellent report, Mr. Puente. That's all I have, Mr. Chair.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any other questions by any other Board Members? All right.

Any final comments, Officer O'Shea?

OFFICER O'SHEA: No, sir. Pursuant to authorization of one of my supervisors, I would invite any one of you, ma'am, gentlemen, to come out on a Friday or a Saturday night and spend the night with us in the Club Zone on U Street and make your own determinations as to whether folks are being over-served, both in the establishment we are talking about and the surrounding establishments.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you for the suggestion, Officer. We, the Board, are doing that. We were supposed to have done that last week Friday, but because of the weather, that was canceled. But the Board will be taking a run in the next -- on a Friday night, from 11:00 until party time, just to experience it.

1	OFFICER O'SHEA: We will be happy to
2	have you.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
4	Unfortunately, it will be controlled. We will be
5	in a van. I don't think we will be able to come
6	out to go into the clubs, but we will be coming
7	out to see what you see. All right. So we will
8	be able to do that.
9	Ms. Yohannes, any final comments?
10	MS. YOHANNES: The only comment that
11	I'll make is that the licensee now has a security
12	plan. The security plan addresses some of the
13	issues that were just raised regarding what
14	happens when a fight ensues and lights coming on,
15	music being turned off and patrons being served
16	alcohol.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So the security
18	plan has been provided to the Board?
19	MS. YOHANNES: Yes.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And it has been
21	approved as legally sufficient?
22	MS. YOHANNES: It yes.

1 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, and what 2 about the RDO? When is it that the establishment has RDO and is it going to be -- when is it that 3 4 the establishment has RDO and will it always have 5 RDO or how is that? They have RDO Fridays 6 MS. YOHANNES: 7 and Saturdays. It is not required -- and holidays as well, 11:00 p.m. to 4:00 a.m. 8 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. So would 10 the establishment agree that it will have RDO 11 Fridays and Saturdays and holidays? 12 MS. YOHANNES: They currently do have 13 RDOs on Fridays and Saturdays and holidays. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, there is 15 a difference, you know? Of course you know I 16 can't order you, but if you tell me that this is 17 what you are going to do, then it becomes 18 something that you are going to do. 19 So all right. You aren't willing to 20 answer that question? That's fine. 21 establishment has RDO. So it's not ordered and

they are not agreeing to do that moving forward.

1	Okay. All right.
2	The Board will take this under
3	advisement and we will decide what further
4	actions, if any, we will take. All right. Thank
5	you for being here today.
6	MS. YOHANNES: Thank you.
7	MR. DANEALE: Thank you.

9	was concluded at 2:26 p.m.)
