4 make the decision, but this is your neighborhood.
5 You know what works for you, and at least if you
6 have, if you do a settlement agreement, both
7 sides will shake hands and they will be happy.

9 be happy, the other one might be unhappy. So

11 work it out. If not, the Board will make a
12 decision for you.

15 you familiar with the protest process, or do you
16 want me to read the instructions that were read
17 before?

18 MR. MONTAGUE: We are now.

19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You are now?

20 All right.

21 And, but I'll also say to you if you
22 have any questions in how to move forward, please
23 contact Ms. April Randall at 202-442-4353, and
24 she will speak to you about the process and walk
25 you through the process so you'll be prepared if

1 the matter goes to a hearing. Okay?

2 Good luck in your mediation, and if I
3 see you on the 8th, I will. If I don't see you,
4 the Board will not take it personally, okay?

5 Have a great day. Thank you very
6 much.

7 MR. MONTAGUE: Thank you.
