CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: We have now moved to our show cause hearing calendar, Case No. 19-CIT-00025, Siroc, License No. 80975.

Would the parties please approach and identify themselves for the record, please.

MS. MARKS: Lindsay Marks for the District.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: I'm sorry, I didn't hear your name, ma'am.

MS. MARKS: Lindsay Marks for the District.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Good morning, Ms. Marks.

MR. LACKOVIC: Martin Lackovic.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Good morning, sir. What is your relationship with the establishment, sir?

MR. LACKOVIC: I'm the owner.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Good morning.
Are there any preliminary matters in
this case?
MS. MARKS: No, Mr. Chairman.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: All right.

Your name again, sir, please?
MR. LACKOVIC: Martin Lackovic.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Lackovic. How do you spell your last name, please?

MR. LACKOVIC: L-A-C-K-O-V-I-C.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Okay, thank you.
Does the Government wish to make an opening statement?

MS. MARKS: Yes, a brief opening.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Yes, go ahead.
MS. MARKS: Good morning, Board members. In this matter there is one charge in front of the Board. The evidence will show that on Thursday, January 10, 2019 Siroc failed to have an owner or superintendent person, or have a Board-approved ABC manager, on duty during its licensed hours of sale. During this time the establishment was opened to the public and had
alcohol unsecured behind the bar. Thank you.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Mr. Lackovic, have you ever participated in a show cause hearing before?

MR. LACKOVIC: I'm sorry?
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Have you ever participated in this type of hearing before?

MR. LACKOVIC: No, I have not.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: All right. The Government has just made its opening statement and the Government will call its witness to prove that you committed the -- to try to prove that you committed the infraction.

At this juncture you can make an opening statement, or you can wait until the Government presents its case and then you can make an opening statement. You can also have your witnesses. Are you the only witness?

MR. LACKOVIC: I am.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: So do you wish to make an opening statement?

MR. LACKOVIC: I'll wait.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: You'll wait? All right. Fine.

Does the Government have a witness it wishes to call?

MS. MARKS: Yes, the Government calls Investigator Kevin Puente.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Mr. Puente, can you raise your right hand, please? Whereupon,

## Kevin Puente

a witness, was called by Counsel for the Government and, after having been first duly sworn, assumed the witness stand and was examined and testified as follows:

## DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MS. MARKS:
Q Good morning, Investigator Puente.
Can you please state your name again and spell it for the record.

A Kevin Puente, K-E-V-I-N P-U-E-N-T-E.
Q Are you currently employed?

A Yes.
Q Where do you work?
A The Alcoholic Beverage Regulation
Administration.
Q What's your title?
A Investigator.
Q How long have you worked at the
Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration?
A Approximately four years.
Q And how long have you been an investigator for ABRA?

A Approximately four years.
Q What's your primary job responsibility
as an investigator?
A I conduct inspections and investigations of licensed $A B C$ establishments in the District of Columbia.

Q And do you typically write investigative reports after you conduct inspections?

A Yes.
Q Are you familiar with the ABC
establishment by the name of Siroc?
A Yes.

Q And did you have the occasion to visit Siroc on January 10, 2019?

A Yes.

Q At approximately what time did you visit Siroc?

A About 10:12 p.m.
Q What were Siroc's hours of operation?
A 11:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m.
Q And what was the purpose of your visit that day?

A Conduct a regulatory inspection.
Q So what happened when you first arrived at the establishment?

A I walked in. I went through the front door and was met by a server/hostess. I identified myself as an ABRA investigator and asked to speak to an ABC manager/owner. They advised me that the person in charge would be back soon and just to kind of wait until he gets back.

Q So there was no ABC manager present when you arrived?

A Yes. No, there was not.
Q And there was no owner present when you arrived?

A No.
Q And the establishment was opened for business?

A Yes, it was pretty crowded. There was people waiting. I overheard the person at the front door tell a group of people they could sit at the bar because they didn't have reservations or something.

Q So was the establishment full when you arrived?

A Yes.
Q And what else did you observe about the establishment when you arrived?

A I observed everyone was sitting down eating. It was very crowded. There was a bar to the left of the front entrance and alcohol was out unsecured.

Q And did an owner eventually arrive?
A Yes. Approximately 25 minutes later
I left to go next door to conduct another regulatory inspection. When I got back he still hadn't arrived. A couple minutes later the owner came in.

Q And did you observe any other violations while you were at the establishment?

A No.
Q Did you subsequently write an investigative report?

A Yes.
Q All right. I'm going to hand you what has been marked as Exhibit 1 and I have extra copies for the Board.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Is it the report?
MS. MARKS: It's the report, yes.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: We have it.
(Whereupon, the above-referred to
document was marked as Exhibit 1 for identification.)

BY MS. MARKS:

Q Can you identify this document?
A Yes, that's my report.
Q Turning to Exhibit 2 of your report, please describe what's in this photo.

A The ABC license.
Q What are the hours of operation listed on the license for Thursdays?

A 11:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m.
Q And turning to Exhibit 3 of your report, please describe what's in this photo.

A The picture of the bar and the alcohol behind the bar.

Q And turning to Exhibit 4 please describe what's in this photo.

A Picture of the bar area as well as people inside the dining room area through the little hallway.

MS. MARKS: The District has no further questions.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: This is your opportunity, sir. to ask him question based on the testimony that he just gave. Do you have any
questions?
MR. LACKOVIC: $I$ have no questions.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Mr. Puente, during the time you were there, did you observe anyone maybe drinking alcohol -- what appeared to be alcohol?

MR. PUENTE: No, I didn't walk through the restaurant. It was fairly crowded so I just stood by the bar area.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: What do you mean fairly crowded?

MR. PUENTE: The restaurant was packed because it's right near the White House during lunch time so $I$ just stood by the bar area because the servers were running around busy so I didn't want to distract them or walk through.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Approximately -I mean, about how many people -- do you know what the capacity is? When you said packed, I'm just trying to figure it out.

MR. PUENTE: Occupancy is 99 and all the tables were filled with patrons eating.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Okay.
Any other questions?
Do you have any questions, Ms. Marks, of the witness based on the questions $I$ asked?

MS. MARKS: No additional questions.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Mr. Puente, you can step down. Thank you very much for your testimony.

Does the Government have any other witnesses?

MS. MARKS: No, Your Honor.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Does the Government rest?

MS. MARKS: Yes, Your Honor.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Mr. Lackovic.
MR. LACKOVIC: Yes, sir.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: All right. So
you're the only witness. Is that correct?
MR. LACKOVIC: That's correct, yes.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: All right. Will
you raise your right hand, please.
Whereupon,

## MARTIN LACKOVIC

a witness, was called by Chairman Anderson and, after having been first duly sworn, assumed the witness stand and was examined and testified as follows:

## DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY CHAIRMAN ANDERSON:
Q How will you defend yourself in this matter, sir?

A We've been there 10 years and we take our responsibility for alcohol very seriously. There are lots of times because of a small business we run out for small errands. We could paid the fine and moved on but I wanted to show that we've had three of my servers certified -- I have their documentation here -- to make sure this doesn't happen again.

I'm here to hopefully try and convince you to waive the fine to show that we do take this responsibility and we are going to be proactive so it doesn't happen again.

Q Is that all you have to say?

A That's all I have to say, yes.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Ms. Marks, do you have any questions you want to ask him?

The reason why is because you testified and she has an opportunity to crossexamine you on your testimony and then the Board will also have an opportunity to do that, too.

MS. MARKS: Just a few questions, Mr. Chair.

## CROSS-EXAMINATION

Q So on the day of January 10th you were open and operating?

A I believe so, yes.
Q Those three additional servers you had certified, when was that?

A They got their licenses -- they passed their certification on 12th of February.

Q Okay. When Investigator Puente arrived there was no ABC manager on duty?

A There was not, no. I was at the bank. That's what I told the investigator when I arrived. It's in the statement.

Q Okay. No further questions.
REDIRECT EXAMINATION
BY CHAIRMAN ANDERSON:
Q I'm looking at -- how long were you gone, sir? How long were you gone from the establishment since it's the heart of lunchtime?

A I was -- well, when we opened up and they found out that we didn't have enough change in the register, because our bank that was two doors down has since closed, $I$ had to go up to Dupont Circle branch. I was probably gone for maybe a little bit more than an hour to get in my car, find parking, walk over, do my transaction, and come back.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Any questions by any of the Board members?

Any questions you wish to ask him on the questions that $I$ asked?

MS. MARKS: No, Mr. Chair.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Any clarification that you wish to make, sir?

MR. LACKOVIC: I'm sorry.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Any clarification --

MR. LACKOVIC: I'm a little bit hard of hearing.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: I apologize. Any clarification that you need to make based on the questions that $I$ asked?

MR. LACKOVIC: No.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Do you have anything else to day?

MR. LACKOVIC: No, sir.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: All right.
Does the Government wish to make a closing argument?

MS. MARKS: Yes, Mr. Chair. Brief closing argument.

Board members, today the Government has provided sufficient evidence to show that on January 10, 2019 Siroc failed to have either an owner, superintendent person, or ABC manager on duty during the licensed hours of sale.

We heard from ABRA investigator Kevin

Puente that on January 10, 2019 he visited the establishment during the lunch hour.

Investigator Puente said he observed that the establishment was full. When he spoke with a female employee, he asked to speak to the ABC manager or owner and none was present.

Investigator Puente waited roughly 20
minutes before the owner of the establishment arrived. During that time the establishment was opened for business and had alcohol behind the bar that was unsecured and accessible to the public for sale, service, and consumption.

The District has, therefore, met its burden and proven the charge. The Government asks for the Board's discretion on what penalty to assess to this establishment for this charge.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Thank you.
What is it you want us to do, sir?
MR. LACKOVIC: I wanted to come in and show how proactive --

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: What is it you want the Board to do?

MR. LACKOVIC: Oh, to waive the fine that was presented to us. I think we've taken some corrective measures and I've come here to show you that we've done that.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Again, what are the corrective measures that you said you have taken?

MR. LACKOVIC: I've got three of my employees to obtain their alcohol beverage handlers license so that anytime an inspector comes in, someone who is certified, an alcohol beverage handler, will be on premise. That's it.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: All right. Thank you.

The record is now closed. Do the parties wish to file proposed findings of fact and conclusion of law or waive their right to do so?

MS. MARKS: The Government waives its right to do so.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Meaning that you want to write something or do you want the Board
to make a decision on the presentation that was made today?

MR. LACKOVIC: You can make a decision.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: The Board will issue a decision within 90 days.

As Chairperson of the Alcohol Beverage Control Board for the District of Columbia in accordance with D.C. Official Code Section 2574(b) of the Open Meetings Act, I move that ABC Board hold a closed meeting for the purpose of seeking legal advice from our counsel on Case No. 19-CIT-00025, Siroc, pursuant to D.C. Official Code Section 2574(b)(4) of the Open Meetings Act and deliberate upon Case No. 19-CiT-00025, Siroc, for the reasons cited in D.C. Official Code Section 2574(b)(13) of the Open Meetings Act.

Is there a second?
MEMBER SHORT: Second.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Mr. Short has
seconded the motion. I will now take a roll call and vote on the motion now that it has been seconded.

Mr. Silverstein.
MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I agree.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Mr. Short.
MEMBER SHORT: I agree.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Mr. Cato.

MEMBER CATO: I agree.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Mr. Anderson. I agree. As it appears that the motion has passed, I hereby give notice that the ABC Board will recess these proceedings to hold a closed meeting in the ABC Board conference room pursuant to Section 2574(b) of the Open Meetings Act.

Thank you. We'll issue a decision in 90 days.

MR. LACKOVIC: Thank you.
CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: The Board will then be in recess until 11:00.
(Whereupon, the above-entitled matter went off the record at 10:54 a.m.)
