ORDER ON DISMISSAL OF APPLICATION

The Application filed by Skip's Liquors, LLC, t/a Skip's Liquors (Applicant), for a renewal of its Retailer's A License, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on June 10, 2024. On June 12, 2024, the Board dismissed the Application because the Applicant failed to appear at the Roll Call Hearing. Subsequently, the Applicant filed for reinstatement claiming lack of notice, because he was traveling out of the country. Nevertheless, ABCA's records show the renewal application was placarded on April 5, 2024, and that appropriate notice of the protest was sent on May 21, 2024. At no point during the renewal period, did the Applicant communicate his unavailability to the agency. As such, the request has no merit and must be denied.

ORDER


Therefore, the Board, on this 26th day of June 2024, hereby **DENIES** the motion for reinstatement. The Applicant is instructed to file a second application to renew their license. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the Parties.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1) (applicable to alcohol matters) or 22-C DCMR § 9720 (applicable to medical cannabis matters), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section II of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code § 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001 (202/879- 1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. *See* D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
