ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR REINSTATEMENT OF APPLICATION

The Application filed by Yoef, Inc., t/a Stanton Liquors (Applicant), for renewal of its Retailer's Class A License, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on June 11, 2018, and a Protest Status Hearing on July 18, 2018.

On July 18, 2018, the Board dismissed the Application, because the Applicant failed to appear at the Protest Status Hearing. See Board Order 2018-456.

On July 27, 2018, Matthew L. Devendorf, Esq., Applicant's Legal Representative, filed a Motion for Reinstatement. Mr. Devendorf explained that the Applicant mistakenly noted at the Roll Call Hearing that the Protest Status Hearing was scheduled for July 19, 2018 rather than July 18, 2018, and thus he missed the hearing. Mr. Devendorf seeks the reinstatement of the Application so that the license can be renewed.

Upon consideration of this request to reinstate the Application, the Board finds that the Applicant's request constitutes good cause to reinstate the Application pursuant to 23 DCMR 1602.3.

ORDER

For these reasons, the Board does hereby, this 1st day of August, 2018, **REINSTATE** the Application filed by Yoef, Inc., t/a Stanton Liquors, for renewal of its Retailer's Class A License. Copies of this Order shall be sent to Matthew L. Devendorf, Applicant's Legal Representative.

However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion.
