## ORDER ON DISMISSAL OF APPLICATION

The Application filed by Suburban Liquors, Inc., t/a Suburban Liquors (Applicant), for renewal of its Retailer's Class A License, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on July 12, 2021.

On July 12, 2021, the Board dismissed the Application because the Applicant failed to appear at the Roll Call Hearing. The Applicant may file a Request for Reinstatement with the Board within ten (10) days from the date of this Order.

Additionally, at the Roll Call Hearing, the Deanwood Citizens Association (Association) did not provide verification that the Association was incorporated under the

laws of the District of Columbia located within the affected area and did not provide evidence that the Applicant was given at least seven (7) days advanced notice of the Association meeting, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-601(3). Thus, the Board's Agent granted conditional standing to the Association in the event the Application is reinstated and the protest proceeds to a Status Hearing.

## **ORDER**

The Board does hereby, this 15th day of July 2021, **DISMISS** the Application. Copies of this Order shall be sent to the Parties.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code§ 25-433(d)(l), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14<sup>th</sup> Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section II of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thi1ty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Coult of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
