4	back on the record. Our next case is Case No.
5	18-CMP-00223, Sushi Keiko, License No. 094610.
6	Will the parties, please, approach and
7	identify themselves for the record, please?
8	There is also after you identify yourself for
9	the record, there is a sign-in sheet, please,
10	sign your name in.
11	So can you, please, identify yourself
12	for the record, please?
13	MR. ZHANG: I my name is Wei Zhang,
14	but I sell the company to Mr. Huang.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on, hold
16	on, sir. Hold on, sir. What is your name, sir?
17	MR. ZHANG: Wei Zhang.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Wei what? Can
19	you spell that?
20	MR. ZHANG: Wei, W-E-I.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Uh-huh.
22	MR. ZHANG: Last name Z-H-A-N-G.

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: W what? What's
2	the last name?
3	MR. ZHANG: W-E-I.
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Uh-huh.
5	MR. ZHANG: The last name is Z-H-A-N-
6	G.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, Mr.

When I entered the establishment, I was brought to the attention of Mr. Huang and he identified himself as the owner and ABC Manager of the establishment.

During that conversation, he stated that he had purchased the business prior. I completed the regulatory inspection, came back to the office and ran a records check in ABRA's records system and determined that the current listed owner was Mr. Wei Zhang.

I called Mr. Huang back and asked him could he provided me any type of documentation that showed that he purchased the business. He did that on the 11th. He sent me an electronic copy of the Stock Purchase Agreement for the Washington DC Asian Food Corporation.

In that agreement it stated that Mr. Huang purchased the corporation from Mr. Zhang and Ms. Zhang.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: When? When?

INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: The purchase
was on June 15, 2018. That's correct, on June

1 15, 2018.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay.

INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: I explained -I called, on the 23rd, Mr. Zhang and asked him did
he complete the Transfer Consent form of the
ownership application? He advised me that he
didn't. He thought that the new owner was going
to take care of that situation. Then I asked him
-- I gave Mr. Huang a call back and asked him did
he complete an ownership application and he
stated no, but he did also advise me that he felt
like both Mr. and Mrs. Zhang didn't know what
they were doing and they sold the business.

So I explained the procedure to him that you can't sell a corporation and transfer an alcohol license without the approval of the Board. And I explained the situation of how they can correct that matter.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And when was this?

INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: That was on Monday, September the 24th.

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: September 24.
2	INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: And one more
3	thing I need to add, also I got in contact with
4	Mr. Dedrick from the Department of Consumer and
5	Regulatory Affairs just to find out who they had
6	listed as the incorporated business and, at that
7	time, he provided me with a document that stated
8	that Mr. Zhang was the incorporated business,
9	Washington DC Asian Food Corporation.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So that was Mr.
11	Zhang?
12	INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: Mr. Zhang, yes,
13	sir.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, did you
15	have when did you have any specific
16	conversations with Mr. Zhang about what is it
17	that he needed to do?
18	INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: That occurred
19	on September the 23rd.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: September of?
21	INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: Of 2018.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Mr.

1	Zhang?
2	MR. ZHANG: Yeah.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You sold the
4	business to Mr. Huang in June. Is that correct?
5	MR. ZHANG: Yes.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And in
7	September, Mr. Gilliam stated that he told you
8	what you needed to do. Is that correct?
9	MR. ZHANG: I remember I think some
10	person called me by the phone.
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right.
12	MR. ZHANG: Tell me say I really don't
13	know this person and he introduce himself.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right.
15	MR. ZHANG: But I really don't know
16	what to do, because of when I sold my sell my
17	company to this person, we have agreement to say
18	that for the alcohol license and he take care to
19	transfer to his name and I supported it. If he
20	needs any documents, I either give to him or give
21	to him and then I sign to it.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, what do

1	you mean by transfer it to his name? What do you
2	mean by that? Explain that to me.
3	MR. ZHANG: Just the alcohol license,
4	because I'm going I sold I sell the
5	license
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right.
7	MR. ZHANG: to that was sell the
8	business to him.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right.
10	MR. ZHANG: I know I have to transfer
11	the alcohol license to him.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right.
13	MR. ZHANG: And then the agreement we
14	have that say
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So how did you
16	transfer the license to him?
17	MR. ZHANG: Yeah, by the process of
18	the Government process.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What Government
20	process? What process?
21	MR. ZHANG: He say I think the DC
22	Affairs over the phone or

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What I'm
2	trying to find out specifically what did you do
3	to transfer the document to him?
4	MR. ZHANG: I really don't know that.
5	That
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Huh?
7	MR. ZHANG: at that time, we don't
8	know. I don't know that.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You don't know
10	what? You told me, that's why I'm asking you.
11	MR. ZHANG: Uh-huh.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You said that
13	you sold him the business.
14	MR. ZHANG: Um-hum.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And he was
16	supposed to have the alcohol license transferred
17	in his name and you would support it.
18	MR. ZHANG: Uh-huh.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So what did
20	that how was he going to get the alcohol
21	license transferred in his name?
22	MR. ZHANG: I think that he should

	nave
2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: He should have
3	what?
4	MR. ZHANG: get some information
5	from them like from the phone or come to the
6	Government and apply that transfer.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you just
8	sold him the business and then you just kept on
9	moving. You didn't turn it you didn't
10	because you said you would have supported him.
11	You said that you so has he done any of that?
12	MR. ZHANG: Because you know, because
13	the first thing I will want to have the the
14	family emergency. I admitted to it after I sold
15	the business to him, after I sell like one week,
16	I admitted to go back to my country. And at that
17	time, I stay over there like more months, because
18	for the family issue.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. But
20	Mr. Gilliam said he spoke to you in September.
21	MR. ZHANG: Yes, yeah.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And he told you

what to do in September. So why did you not do 1 2 nothing with that? He told you that you can't just sell the business to him. You have to come 3 4 to the ABC Board and fill in some paperwork to 5 start the process. So and he told you that in September. 6 MR. ZHANG: Yes, he told me that and 7 8 I -- after he told --9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead. 10 MR. ZHANG: So let me explain. Okay. After this gentleman called me and actually I 11 12 tell you the truth, I really don't know this 13 gentleman. Although he introduce himself, I 14 don't know, because of, what do I want to say, someone called me --15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on. 16 Let him finish and then I'll --17 18 INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: Okay. I just 19 want to clarify one thing that will maybe move it 20 along. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes. 22 I called him on INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM:

a Sunday and he is not used to the Government 1 2 official working on a Sunday. So I had explained myself. 3 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes. INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: I identified 5 myself, went through the whole process before he 6 felt comfortable talking to me, because he wasn't 7 8 used to nobody, a Government official working on 9 a Sunday. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: That's what his 11 12 issue was. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, Mr. 14 Alberti. MEMBER ALBERTI: Mr. Zhang, I was --15 16 I should have been paying closer attention. I'm 17 I think you said that when you checked 18 the District records, go over that again about 19 who is like registered as the owner or -- of this 20 business. 21 INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: Okay. So after I completed the inspection on September 9th, I 22

1	came back and checked the ABRA records and we had
2	Mr. Wei Zhang and Ms. Min Zhang listed as the
3	owners of the alcohol license.
4	MEMBER ALBERTI: Right.
5	INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: That was the
6	current list.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. DCRA.
8	MEMBER ALBERTI: What about the DCRA?
9	INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: And the
10	information that I received from DCRA, that
11	listed Mr. Zhang as the incorporated business,
12	meaning the owner of the business.
13	MEMBER ALBERTI: Incorporated
14	business. All right.
15	INVESTIGATOR GILLIAM: Yes.
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
17	MEMBER ALBERTI: Just one moment.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Mr.
19	Huang I'm sorry, yes, Mr. Zhang?
20	MR. ZHANG: I'm sorry. Can I explain
21	a little bit more? After this gentleman call me,
22	I immediately call the Mr. Huang and I tell him

1	say some guy called me and say about this kind of
2	things and I say did you do that process and he
3	said he is doing that. And I said okay.
4	Anything you needed me to help you or need I
5	sign, I do it. And actually we did, I signed
6	some document that say for the notary and the
7	bank, I signed that.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What document
9	did you sign?
10	MR. ZHANG: It's
11	MR. HUANG: May I?
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Mr.
13	Zhang. I'm sorry, Mr. Zhang, right?
14	MR. HUANG: Huang.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Huang. I
16	apologize. Now, you bought this business. So
17	can you tell us what, if anything, you have done
18	to transfer this business into your name. The
19	business, the alcohol license, you tell me, sir.
20	MR. HUANG: Okay. So first of all,
21	I'm not familiar with the alcohol license at all.
22	So once I purchased the company, I know that it's

1	no longer a restaurant, so somebody in the
2	restaurant is to have like ABC Manager's License.
3	That's the only thing I know.
4	So I proceed with applying that
5	application and I got through.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you applied
7	for someone to be an ABC Manager?
8	MR. HUANG: The ABC Manager. Me,
9	myself.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you are the
11	ABC Manager?
12	MR. HUANG: Yes.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So when you
14	came here to apply to be an ABC Manager, what did
15	you tell them? What did you tell the Agency? So
16	you came down here and applied to be the ABC
17	Manager.
18	MR. HUANG: Right.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is that
20	correct?
21	MR. HUANG: Yes, that's correct.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So what did you

1 tell them?

MR. HUANG: So I am applying for the ABC Manager. I didn't know the whole process, because I got the ABC Manager in June and then Inspector Gilliam told me about the whole process that you have to do the transfer process. And after that, I immediately applied for the transfer application.

Currently, right now, it is in the process with Ms. Walker.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So when did you do that, sir? When?

MR. HUANG: The last time I spoke with her is like a week ago. All applications completed, whatever she required, I have submitted already.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you have submitted that information to this Agency a week ago and they told you that all the information was -- that they have all the information.

MR. HUANG: A week ago was finished.

I started like maybe a month ago or something.

1	MEMBER ALBERTI: Can I ask a real
2	quick question?
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, Mr.
4	Alberti.
5	MEMBER ALBERTI: So, Mr. Huang, Mr.
6	Gilliam was telling us when he goes to DCRA, that
7	Mr. Zhang is listed as the owner of the business
8	and the corporation or whatever it is.
9	MR. HUANG: So yeah.
10	MEMBER ALBERTI: Anyway, the business
11	entity. All right?
12	MR. HUANG: Yes.
13	MEMBER ALBERTI: So well, wait, wait,
14	wait. Have you gotten a business license for
15	this place?
16	MR. HUANG: SO
17	MEMBER ALBERTI: You have been
18	operating this place. You have owned it since
19	when?
20	MR. HUANG: so the corporation
21	MEMBER ALBERTI: Well, wait, wait.
22	Let me ask you, you have owned it since when?

1	MR. HUANG: Owned it since June.
2	MEMBER ALBERTI: Since June?
3	MR. HUANG: Yes, June.
4	MEMBER ALBERTI: What's the status of
5	your basic business license for this operation?
6	MR. HUANG: It still valid, because
7	the corporation name doesn't change.
8	MEMBER ALBERTI: But the owner. You
9	haven't listed the owner is Mr. Zhang. How can
10	you get a basic business license in your name if
11	Mr. Zhang maybe I don't know the rules of
12	DCRA, but how can you get a basic business
13	license in your name if Mr. Zhang owns it,
14	according to the city's records?
15	MR. HUANG: The basic business license
16	is under corporation's name.
17	MEMBER ALBERTI: Ah.
18	MR. HUANG: Right?
19	MEMBER ALBERTI: But the city still
20	believes that Mr. Zhang owns it.
21	MR. HUANG: Right.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But did you

	change the officers?
2	MR. HUANG: Yeah, that's one of the
3	things that I have to take care of, which is
4	change the ownership. So it's everything already
5	completed be all legal, but through DCRA it's not
6	completed yet.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So when is it
8	that you because when is it that you plan to
9	go to DCRA to change the officers of this
10	corporation?
11	MR. HUANG: I didn't hear about this.
12	Only today.
13	MR. ZHANG: Sorry, I remember this
14	conversation way normally, we should ask our
15	counsel.
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, go
17	ahead, sir.
18	MR. ZHANG: The transfer the
19	ownership, because I sold the company to him.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right.
21	MR. ZHANG: So just change the company
22	ownership, just changing the name to some

1	MR. HUANG: We don't change the name.
2	MR. ZHANG: No, I said the owner.
3	MR. HUANG: The owner purchase.
4	MR. ZHANG: The owner needs.
5	MR. HUANG: Yes, yeah.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right. So he
7	has to file the because it's a is it a
8	corporation? So then he has to file the proper
9	documents with DCRA to change who the officers of
10	the corporation is.
11	MR. ZHANG: Well, because one time I
12	told the, what say, account, we have account and
13	we use the same account. I told her I come to
14	say maybe you can ask do this account. I don't
15	know he did it or not. I think
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
17	Just we will we are going to recess. All
18	right. We are going to be in recess and just
19	don't move. Just wait there. Okay. We will be
20	in recess for a couple of minutes.
21	(Whereupon, the above-entitled matter

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

We're back on the record. Mr. Zhang, you are still on the hook because you are still the owner of this establishment. So you need to make sure that Mr. Huang do what he is supposed to do, because in the interim, if there are any ABC violations, you are the only person that we are coming after.

MR. ZHANG: Okay.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So basically what I am going to say it is Mr. Huang, it's up to him to do it, but I'm letting you know --

MR. ZHANG: Okay.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- that if he does not do it, so you might need to light some fire to make sure that he does it, because as far as the ABC Board is concerned, you are, until a new license is issued, responsible for any violation, any ABC alcohol violations that occurs in that business.

MR. ZHANG: Okay. So for example, I

1 send the email to him. I say get your license, 2 change in your name. You cannot sell the alcohol. 3 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's between 5 you and him. Okay? Yeah, I understand. 6 MR. ZHANG: CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 7 That's between 8 I'm just letting you know that as you and him. far as until a new license is issued to him --9 10 MR. ZHANG: Okay. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: It's still your 12 responsibility. 13 MR. ZHANG: Okay. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. This is 15 where we are. Mr. Huang, and I'm not giving you 16 legal advice, but in order to -- for this process 17 to be straightened, you need to go to DCRA, sir, 18 to change the officers of the corporation. 19 It's my understanding that you are 20 listed as the president and there is a Miss or 21 Ms. Huang who is listed as a vice president. 22 MR. HUANG: Um-hum.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. You need to provide -- you need to go to DCRA. You need to go to DCRA and have that done forthwith.

In order for this process, the transfer to be completed, you need to provide us with the settlement documents. You also need to provide us with the ownership of the corporation, meaning that you have to go to DCRA and change the information over in your name and Ms. Huang's name to say that you are the ownership or owner of the corporation.

And I'm not sure if you have -- and you need to provide us a basic business license to have this done.

Now, if -- we are going to give you 10 business day to do that. I think that is more than sufficient time. This has been going on since June. All of this should have occurred prior to -- this has been since June.

Mr. Gilliam has also informed you of the changes that needed to be made in September. We are now in December. So I believe that 10 --

1 yes, sir? 2 MR. HUANG: So what about the pending application that you currently have right now? 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well --4 MR. HUANG: I assume that you have. 5 -- but in order CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 6 7 for it to be completed, there are certain things 8 that you have to give us. 9 MR. HUANG: Okav. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 10 That's what I'm 11 saying, so, yes, we have your application. 12 the Agency will not issue a license to you until 13 these things are done. And if these are not 14 done, the Agency will issue a cease and desist order to prevent you or Mr. -- and as I told Mr. 15 16 -- to prevent Mr. Zhang from operating. 17 MR. HUANG: Yeah, I just want to -- so 18 we have understanding that I am trying to do 19 something like I'm not doing anything, so I have 20 submitted the application for --21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But you have

provided information to this Agency.

MR. HUANG: Right.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But as far as this Agency is concerned, Mr. Zhang is -- although it's the same business name, when we decide if we are going to issue a violation, it is going to Mr. Zhang, because he is still the owner of the corporation. There is nothing -- it's not apparent to me that ABRA doesn't know and DCRA doesn't know who you are.

You provided the information to us to say that this is still the same business. We are not piercing -- we had not -- this Agency had not pierced the corporate veil to see who were the actual owners.

In your application to us, you said that it was you and Ms. Huang were the owners of this new corporation, but we had not asked -- but we are asking you now that you need to provide the corporate documents.

MR. HUANG: From DCRA?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And DCRA will issue the documents to say that you have changed

the ownership of the corporation.

going.

MR. HUANG: Okay. I'm not sure how long it takes, because it's new to me to have DCRA provide the document to me, but I will --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, I think if you had -- well, let me say this to you, sir. If you want to continue operating this business, you will go to DCRA and you will do that. It has been going on since June.

MR. HUANG: Right, right.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now --

MR. HUANG: I'm not saying I'm not

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- if it takes 20 days, at least you can go to DCRA and say here is a copy. I don't think that the Agency is going to say that if you go to DCRA and provide us with proof that you started the process, that is date stamped and if they tell you that it is going to take 30 days to issue it, I don't believe -- the Agency is not going to issue a cease and desist because once we know that you

1	have done your process and you are waiting for
2	the Agency.
3	MR. HUANG: Okay.
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What I'm we
5	are going to issue the cease and desist to make
6	sure that you do it and that's I'm telling Mr.
7	Zhang to let him know that if there are any
8	violations currently, he is responsible.
9	So you, sir, if you want to make sure
10	that you believe you sold this business in June
11	and you can go on another vacation, you can't,
12	you are still responsible.
13	MR. ZHANG: Yeah, I understand that
14	part, but at that time, you know, I saw the I
15	told accountant them can't do that.
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But what I'm
17	saying, sir -
18	MR. ZHANG: Yeah, yeah.
