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**ORDER TO CEASE AND DESIST**

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The Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) has reviewed its records and determined that My Little Bistro and Shop, LLC, t/a Taco-Ma Yucatan Chicken (Respondent), has failed to renew its License No. ABRA-101229, a Retailer's Class CR License.

All Retailer's CR licenses were scheduled for the renewal of their license on March 31, 2022. Due to unforeseen circumstances, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) granted all Retailer's CR licenses an extension to July 12, 2022, to renew their license and pay the license fee.

Despite the extension of the renewal deadline and written notice of the missed deadline, the Respondent failed to renew the license for the period of 2022 to 2023 by July 12, 2022, the modified deadline for all Retailer's CR licenses. Therefore, the Respondent's license has **EXPIRED** and it will remain expired until the Respondent pays the required renewal fee and the daily fine of \$50.00 imposed by the Board for late payment.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-829, the Respondent is therefore **ORDERED** by the Board on this 9th day of November 2022, to **STOP selling, serving, or permitting the consumption of alcoholic beverages at the Respondent's establishment** until the renewal and payment of the license fee and any associated fines are received by ABRA. The Respondent may not allow the sale, service, or permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages on the licensed premises until the ABC License is reinstated by the Board.

A copy of this Order is being forwarded to the Metropolitan Police Department and D.C. licensed Wholesalers to ensure compliance. Failure to comply with this Order will subject the Respondent to the maximum civil penalties provided by the law.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14<sup>th</sup> Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section II of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879- 1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
