# Wednesday February 12, 2020

The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in the Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson, presiding.

3	MEMBER ANDERSON: All right. I'm		
4	going to go out of order. So our next case, it's		
5	show cause hearing case number 19-CC-00099, Texas		
6	Grocery Store, license number 94776. Would the		
7	parties please approach and identify themselves		
8	for the record, please?		
9	MR. FACCI: Good morning, Mr. Chairman		
10	and members of the Board. Jason Facci on behalf		
11	of the District of Columbia.		
12	MEMBER ANDERSON: Good morning, Mr.		
13	Facci.		
14	MR. DIETZ: Good morning. I'm Bernard		
15	Dietz. I represent the licensee.		
16	MEMBER ANDERSON: Good morning, Mr.		
17	Dietz. Is the licensee here today?		
18	MR. DIETZ: No, I		
19	MEMBER ANDERSON: No, I was just		
20	asking.		
21	MR. DIETZ: I spoke with him yesterday		
22	and asked him to be here by 10:30. It's 10:20		
23	now. We were scheduled for 11:00 a.m.		
24	MEMBER ANDERSON: Is the licensee		
25	going to be here today?		

MR. DIETZ: I expect him to be here in 1 2 about 10 minutes. 3 MEMBER ANDERSON: Well, then if the 4 licensee is going to be here, then I will -- why 5 not recall the case when -- you tell me. I was told that you guys have a preliminary matter, but 6 7 should I move forward or should I wait for your 8 client to show up, sir? 9 MR. FACCI: I'm fine either way, Mr. Chairman. 10 11 MEMBER ANDERSON: You tell me, Mr. 12 Do you want to wait for your client, or Dietz. 13 do you want to move forward without him since you 14 told your client at 10:30? It's not 10:30 yet. 15 MR. DIETZ: I've discussed this matter 16 with my client in great detail as late as 17 yesterday evening. He's fully aware of the offer 18 in compromise and he's agreed to the terms. 19 MEMBER ANDERSON: So you want to move 20 forward without your client being here? 21 MR. DIETZ: Yes. 22 MEMBER ANDERSON: All right. 23 there any preliminary matters, Mr. Facci? 24 MEMBER ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. Chairman. 25 We have an offer in compromise.

1 MEMBER ANDERSON: And what is that, 2 please? 3 MR. FACCI: So with respect to charge 4 1, a \$4,000 fine to be paid within 60 days or the 5 license shall be suspended indefinitely until the 6 fine is paid. 7 The license shall be suspended for 10 8 days with four days to be served and six days 9 stayed for one year. And that four-day suspension is to begin on February 24, 2020. 10 All 11 employees who served alcoholic beverages --12 MEMBER ANDERSON: What are the 13 specific days? That would be -- brief 14 MR. FACCI: 15 indulgence for a calendar -- February 24th, 25th, 16 26th and 27th, 2020. 17 MEMBER ANDERSON: Okay. 18 MR. FACCI: In addition, all employees 19 who serve alcoholic beverages in the licensed establishment will complete alcohol training 20 21 within three months from the date of today's 22 offer in compromise. 23 And in addition, the establishment 24 shall serve a five-day suspension which is 25 activated from case number 19-CC-00035. And that

five-day suspension is begin on March 23rd and continue on March 24th, 25th, 26th and March 27th.

In addition, there is a second charge in this case. With respect to charge number 2, the offer in compromise is for a \$2,500 fine to be paid within 60 days or the license shall be suspended indefinitely until the fine is paid.

MEMBER ANDERSON: Mr. Dietz, it's my understanding that there's an offer in compromise. And the offer in compromise is that for charge 1, there is a \$4,000 fine payable within 60 days.

If the fine is not payable within 60 days, the license will be suspended indefinitely until the fine has been paid. That along with this charge, the license will be suspended for 10 days, four days to be served and six days will be stayed for one year.

The four days to be served are

February 24th, February 25th, February 26th and

February 27th, that all employees who serve

alcoholic beverages in the licensed establishment

complete an alcohol awareness training within

three months from today's date.

And that based on this violation, the respondent shall serve an additional five days, which were activated from case number 19-CC-00035. Therefore, the establishment will be --their license will be suspended again from March 23rd, on March 23rd, March 24th, March 25th, March 26th and March 27th.

Charge 2, that there is a \$2,500 fine that must be paid within 60 days. If the fine is not paid within 60 days, the license will be suspended indefinitely. Is this your understanding? Is this you and your client's understanding, sir, of the offer in compromise?

MR. DIETZ: Yes. It's my understanding, and it's my client's understanding.

MEMBER ANDERSON: And is your client aware that by accepting an offer in compromise that they're giving up their right to a hearing?

MR. DIETZ: Yes.

MEMBER ANDERSON: And is your client aware that by accepting the offer in compromise that they're giving up their right to appeal this matter?

MR. DIETZ: Yes, he does.

MEMBER ANDERSON: All right. With that said, I make a motion that the offer in compromise be accepted. For charge 1, there is a \$4,000 fine payable within 60 days.

If the fine is not paid within 60 days, the license shall be suspended indefinitely until the fine has been paid, that the licensee shall -- the license shall also be suspended for 10 days with four days to be served and six days to be stayed for one year provided there are no further violation.

The four days to be served are

February 24th, February 25th, February 26th and

February 27, 2020, that all employees who serve

alcoholic beverages in the licensed establishment

complete an alcohol awareness training within

three months from the date of the OIC and that as

a result of this infraction that the respondent

shall serve an additional five days, which are

activated from case number 19-CC-00035.

The five days that the license will be suspended are March 23rd, March 24th, March 25th, March 26th and March 27, 2020. For charge 2, that there is a \$2,500 fine payable within 60 days.

If the fine is not payable within 60 days, the license will be suspended indefinitely until the fine has been paid. Is there a second?

MEMBER SHORT: Second.

MEMBER ANDERSON: Mr. Short has seconded the motion. All those in favor, say aye.

(Chorus of ayes)

MEMBER ANDERSON: Those opposed? The matter passed 6-0-0. The Board will issue a Board order within this matter, sir. However, please ensure that your client is aware of the suspension days, that even if the Board order is not issued that the license will be suspended -- is being suspended February 24th, February 25th, February 26th and February 27, 2020 and also March 23rd, March 24th, March 25th, March 26th and March 27.

And what this means is that the license -- the establishment can be open.

However, they cannot serve, sell alcohol.

And I hope that is clear that if there's any alcohol in the establishment, it needs to be secured because they cannot sell any alcohol during that period of time. Thank you.
