ORDER VACATING CEASE AND DESIST

On October 19, 2022, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) issued Board Order No. 2022-725 ordering The Mediterranean Way Co., t/a The Mediterranean Way Gourmet Market (Respondent), holder of a Retailer's Class B License No. ABRA-098845, to stop selling alcoholic beverages at the Respondent's establishment until payment of the third-year license fees and any associated fines are received by ABRA.

On October 20, 2022, the Respondent paid the license fees for the period of 2022 to 2023.

It is hereby **ORDERED** that the **ORDER TO CEASE AND DESIST** issued against the Respondent by the Board on October 19, 2022, pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-829 (2001), be and hereby is **VACATED**.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section II of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code § 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879- 1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
