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The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street N.W., Washington, D.C., Ms. LaVerne Fletcher, Agent, presiding.
P-R-O-C-E-E-D-I-N-G-S

AGENT FLETCHER: Would the parties in the matter of The Darcey Hotel, please, come forward? This is Case No. 18-PRO-00009, License No. ABRA-102437. This is a Retailer Class CH substantial change to increase the total occupancy load of the summer garden from 40 to 140 with seating for 100.

My name is LaVerne Fletcher. I'm conducting the Roll Call Hearing as the Board's Agent.

Introductions beginning with the Applicant, please.

MR. FONSECA: Michael Fonseca on behalf of the Licensee.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you. Mr. Fonseca, would you spell your name for the record, please?

MR. FONSECA: Yes. Michael, M-I-C-H-A-E-L and Fonseca, F-O-N-S-E-C-A.

AGENT FLETCHER: And present on behalf
of ANC-2B?
MR. DOWNS: This is Randy Downs, Commissioner for 2B05. R-A-N-D-Y D-O-W-N-S.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr. Downs. And is Steve Kameny here?

MR. KAMENY: Yes, I go by Steven
Kameny. S-T-E-V-E-N last name Kameny, K-A-M-E-NY. Good morning, Ms. Fletcher.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr.
Kameny. And you have other individuals from your group present today?

MR. KAMENY: Yes, we have several, so I believe most in the audience are here for us. We have all these individuals here who are signatories.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. KAMENY: Would you like for them to come and --

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, right beside you and just state your name and spell it for the record.

MR. KAMENY: Great.

AGENT FLETCHER: Slide the microphone.
MR. KAMENY: So there is a microphone right there, people come in and state their name.

MR. MASTIN: Paul Mastin and it's P-A-U-L M-A-S-T-I-N.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you. Um-hum.
MS. MASTIN: Hi, I'm Katie Mastin. K-A-T-I-E and then M-A-S-T-I-N.

MS. DeHART: Meredith DeHart. M-E-R-E-D-I-T-H D-E capital H-A-R-T.

MR. COGGINS: Robert Coggins. First name $\mathrm{R}-\mathrm{O}-\mathrm{B}-\mathrm{E}-\mathrm{R}-\mathrm{T}$ last name $\mathrm{C}-\mathrm{O}-\mathrm{G}-\mathrm{G}-\mathrm{I}-\mathrm{N}-\mathrm{S}$.

MS. MORRIS: Yolanda Morris. First name $\mathrm{Y}-\mathrm{O}-\mathrm{L}-\mathrm{A}-\mathrm{N}-\mathrm{D}-\mathrm{A}$ last name $\mathrm{M}-\mathrm{O}$ double $\mathrm{R}-\mathrm{I}-\mathrm{S}$.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you.
MR. McDONALD: Robert McDonald, R-O-B-E-R-T M-C capital D-O-N-A-L-D.

MR. BRENGLE: Keith Brengle, K-E-I-T-H last name $B-R-E-N-G-L-E . \quad I$ have a proxy for two neighbors that I would represent. Do I present their names to you as well?

AGENT FLETCHER: Yeah, uh-huh.

MR. BRENGLE: Okay. The first one is Caterina Luppi. Her first name is C-A-T-E-R-I-NA last name L-U-P-P-I. And the other is Saul Gonzalez Martirena. It's S-A-U-L G-O-N-Z-A-L-EZ M-A-R-T-I-R-E-N-A.

AGENT FLETCHER: Is that one person?
MR. BRENGLE: Yes, that's correct.
AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Spell the name beginning with the M again.

MR. BRENGLE: Uh-huh, it's M-A-R-T-I-R-E-N-A.

AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you. And Mr. Brengle is it?

MR. BRENGLE: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: I'll take those. So does that mean that Mr. -- you will represent these individuals instead of Mr. Kameny?

MR. BRENGLE: So I guess the question is do $I$ have an opportunity to speak as well? I do not abut the property.

AGENT FLETCHER: Oh.
MR. BRENGLE: But I am affected by the
property.
AGENT FLETCHER: Oh, yeah, you are good. Yeah, this is not an abutting property owner issue, so you are good.

MR. BRENGLE: So I would like to also have another voice.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.
MR. BRENGLE: This occupancy is forever.

AGENT FLETCHER: And you signed the Protest Letter --

MR. BRENGLE: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: -- as well? And the two individuals that you are representing also signed the Protest Letter?

MR. BRENGLE: Yes.
AGENT FLETCHER: The Protest Letter has Mr. Kameny representing everybody, just so that you know.

MR. BRENGLE: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: And so --
MR. BRENGLE: Well, 1 can pull out.

It's fine.
AGENT FLETCHER: You don't have to pull out. I just wanted you to know that because I have these two letters, what that means to us here that either you or Mr. Kameny can represent these two people.

MR. BRENGLE: I can have Steven represent us. I just thought more voices actually helped. It doesn't matter.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yeah, so that -- but just so that you know.

MR. BRENGLE: Yes, thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: Mr. Kameny is recognized as the designated representative, so that if you -- although you could also represent these two people, because they said so.

MR. BRENGLE: I'll let him represent all of us.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Well, then we will stick with that.

MR. BRENGLE: Okay.
MR. KAMENY: Thank you and I just want
to underline I think that he wanted an opportunity to speak. And, Ms. Fletcher, if it's appropriate, he may have an opportunity to do so.

AGENT FLETCHER: So what will happen, that opportunity would come if there is a Protest Hearing, any witness that you want to call that is in your group, you can call.

MR. KAMENY: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: The -- at this stage, we are going to be trying to resolve the matter and so --

MR. KAMENY: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. BRENGLE: We will defer to Steven, all three.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Well, then -okay. Thank you.

MR. BRENGLE: I can rescind those back if you would like.

AGENT FLETCHER: You can take them back if you like.

MR. BRENGLE: Yes.

AGENT FLETCHER: The record will reflect that you took them back.

MR. BRENGLE: I just wanted to know we are represented.

AGENT FLETCHER: You are represented.
MR. KAMENY: So there is some discussion, I think, about designation of the letter, because the ABRA letter that we received said in it be sure to designate someone as your representative. In the letter itself that the signatories signed --

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. KAMENY: -- it said "We, the undersigned, designate" --

AGENT FLETCHER: That's the letter that we --

MR. KAMENY: -- myself, "Steven
Kameny."
AGENT FLETCHER: Exactly.
MR. KAMENY: And I called ABRA and confirmed --

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.

MR. KAMENY: -- it is fine, but we appreciate having extra voices.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. KAMENY: I think it underlines how strongly the community feels about this issue.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. Thank you. And so from this point, everybody can be seated. Mr. Kameny, you need to stay at the table.

MR. KAMENY: Thank you. Do we have everyone?

AGENT FLETCHER: Just -- I only need you.

MR. KAMENY: Great. Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. I have the names that were -- of the individuals that spoke.

MR. KAMENY: Great.
AGENT FLETCHER: But your name is the only one that we need actually on the sign-in sheet, but your contact information is on the sign-in sheet already?

MR. KAMENY: Yes, it is.
AGENT FLETCHER: I count eight
individuals from your group present today, Mr. Kameny .

MR. KAMENY: I believe that's correct. Is there anyone else? No, I think that's --

AGENT FLETCHER: What that means is your group is granted standing as a Protestant.

MR. KAMENY: Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: And granted full standing as a Protestant. And at the upcoming Status Hearing, only you would need to appear.

MR. KAMENY: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: Only you need to appear for the mediation as well as the designated representative. We recognize that you are speaking on behalf of the group.

MR. KAMENY: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: And ANC-2B also has standing as a Protestant.

We need to set a date for a mediation, Status Hearing and a Protest Hearing.

The date for the Status Hearing is
March the 21st.

MR. KAMENY: March 21st.
AGENT FLETCHER: March 21st at 9:30.
March 21 at 9:30.
MR. KAMENY: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: And the Protest Hearing is set for April the 25th at 4:30.

MR. DOWNS: 4:30 p.m.?
AGENT FLETCHER: 4:30 p.m., yes.
MR. FONSECA: I believe -- give me a second. Obviously, we don't know if we will settle, but $I$ already have a 1:30 Protest Hearing and I think it's going to take a whole lot out of me to have that --

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. FONSECA: -- date. I know the Board tends to use it and then perhaps the General Counsel will move it around.

AGENT FLETCHER: Well, you know, Mr. Fonseca, what $I$ am going to do, $I$ just made a note right here that you have a Protest Hearing on that day as well at 1:30 and, let's see excuse me one second.

MR. FONSECA: I want to be optimistic that we can settle.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, but --
MR. FONSECA: So --
AGENT FLETCHER: -- I'll let --
MR. FONSECA: -- it will be done with.
MR. KAMENY: I want to express our hope that it settles, too.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. KAMENY: And I also want to
express that as the representative, $I$ will have maximum flexibility to change around the schedule if there are any needs. And $I$ hope that on the other side, that is as well. So if we need to ask to change the date or time, we are happy to do so and we hope that the similar courtesy would happen for the applicants.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. And so, Mr. Fonseca, I did just make a note that you have another hearing on that date at 1:30.

MR. FONSECA: All right.
AGENT FLETCHER: So we will go see
what happens.
MR. KAMENY: So just to clarify, ma'am, if there is a need, medical issue, personal issue of any sort, we could also ask for a change in time, if necessary?

AGENT FLETCHER: Yeah, or you could designate another representative --

MR. KAMENY: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: -- to represent you.
MR. KAMENY: Great.
AGENT FLETCHER: But yeah, either way.
MR. KAMENY: There is flexibility. Okay.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. KAMENY: Good to know. Thank you.
AGENT FLETCHER: You're welcome. We need to set a date for mediation.

MR. KAMENY: Okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: I'll give you the next available date. Ideally, that would occur before the Status Hearing, but I'll let you know what is available.

MR. FONSECA: If we could, I think -I mean, $I$ talked to Steven when we first came in. It is a large group that he has beyond the eight that are here, obviously, so $I$ know he wants to meet with them. And we agree we should attempt to at least get the confines of some form of an agreement before we meet with you for mediation.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. FONSECA: If we can push it out a little closer to the status, maybe the week before.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.
MR. FONSECA: What do you think?
MR. KAMENY: That sounds good to me. Thank you.

AGENT FLETCHER: Well, what about Thursday, March 15?

MR. KAMENY: March 15? Let me -- a moment, please.

AGENT FLETCHER: Uh-huh.
MR. FONSECA: $I$ think $I$ have got a conflict.

AGENT FLETCHER: We could do the --
MR. FONSECA: The Friday?
AGENT FLETCHER: Friday, I won't be here on that day.

MR. FONSECA: Oh, that's right.
AGENT FLETCHER: We can do --
MR. FONSECA: Tuesday --
AGENT FLETCHER: -- Tuesday the 13th.
MR. FONSECA: -- the 13th.
MR. KAMENY: Tuesday should tentatively be fine.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.
MR. KAMENY: If there is any problem, I'll talk to you.

AGENT FLETCHER: 11:30, 1:00?
MR. KAMENY: Thursday the 13th? Oh, excuse me, Tuesday the 13th?

AGENT FLETCHER: Uh-huh.
MR. FONSECA: Does 1:00 work for you?
MR. KAMENY: If there is --
MR. FONSECA: It's 11:30.
MR. KAMENY: -- right now, it's a
little in the future, so you said 1:00 p.m.?
MR. FONSECA: 1:00. There is 11:30 or 1:00.

MR. KAMENY: Oh, whatever you prefer is fine with me.

MR. FONSECA: Let's say 1:00.
MR. KAMENY: 1:00 p.m., okay.
AGENT FLETCHER: Mr. Downs, is that good for you?

MR. DOWNS: 1:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 13th, yes.

AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.
MR. KAMENY: Ms. Fletcher, just to confirm, the mediation is then set for March 13th at 1:00 p.m. followed by a Status Hearing on March 21st at 9:30 a.m.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. KAMENY: And then a full protest, should it become necessary, and all the parties hope that it does not, April 25th, 4:30 p.m.

AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. Those are all of the dates.

Any questions at all?
MR. KAMENY: I think we are good.
Thank you for your time.
AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you for coming. MR. FONSECA: Thank you.

AGENT FLETCHER: The Roll Call Hearing is concluded.

MR. KAMENY: And thanks to everyone who showed up today. I appreciate that.
(Whereupon, the Roll Call Hearing was concluded at 10:40 a.m.)
