ORDER GRANTING REINSTATEMENT OF APPLICATION

The Application filed by 1327 Connecticut, LLC, t/a The Manor, for a Substantial Change to add a new Summer Garden to its Retailer's Class CT License, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on August 13 2018, and a Protest Status Hearing on September 26, 2018.

On September 26, 2018, the Board dismissed the Application because the Applicant failed to appear at the Protest Status Hearing. *See* Board Order 2018-561.

On October 3, 2018, Oneal Grey, on behalf of the Applicant, filed a request for reinstatement. Mr. Grey explained that a medical emergency prevented him from attending the Protest Status Hearing. Mr. Grey seeks the reinstatement of the Application so he and the Protestants would be able to negotiate a settlement agreement.

Upon consideration of this request to reinstate the Application, the Board finds that the Applicant's request constitutes good cause to reinstate the Application pursuant to 23 DCMR 1602.3.

ORDER

For these reasons, the Board does hereby, this 17th day of October, 2018, **REINSTATE** the Application filed by 1327 Connecticut, LLC, t/a The Manor, for a Substantial Change to add a new Summer Garden to its Retailer's Class CT License.
