ORDER GRANTING REQUEST FOR REINSTATEMENT

The Application filed by 1327 Connecticut, LLC, t/a The Manor (Licensee), for a Substantial Change to add a new Summer Garden (Application) to its Retailer's License, Class CT, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on August 13, 2018, and a Protest Status Hearing on September 26, 2018.

On October 3, 2018, the Board dismissed the Licensee's Application due to his failure to appear at the Protest Status Hearing.

On October 9, 2018, the Licensee filed a timely Motion for Reinstatement of the Application; explaining that he failed to appear due to a medical emergency. Neither the Dupont

Circle Citizens Association nor Advisory Neighborhood Association 2B filed an opposition to the Licensee's motion. Thus, this matter is ripe for the Board's consideration.

Having reviewed the Licensee's motion, the Board finds that there was good cause for the Licensee's failure to attend the Protest Status Hearing, and as such, grants the reinstatement of the Application.

ORDER

The Board does hereby, this 19th day of October, 2018, **REINSTATE** the Application filed by 1327 Connecticut, LLC, t/a The Manor.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Protest Hearing is scheduled for December 5, 2018, at 4:30 p.m. Failure to attorney the Protest Hearing may result in the dismissal of the Protest Petition or the Application.
