4	next case is a Show Cause Hearing Case No. 17-
5	CMP-00368, The Ugly Mug Dining Saloon, License
6	No. 71793.
7	Would the parties, please, approach
8	and identify themselves for the record, please?
9	MR. RIVERO: Good morning, Board
10	Members. Fernando Rivero for the District of
11	Columbia.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Rivero.
13	MR. JEBLONSKI: Good morning. Gayner
14	Jeblonski, owner of The Ugly Mug.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Your last name,
16	sir?
17	MR. JEBLONSKI: Jeblonski.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Jeblonski.
19	MR. JEBLONSKI: Yes.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning.
21	How are you? Good morning.
22	All right. We have a Show Cause

Hearing (Status). Before we start, are there any 1 2 preliminary matters in this case? There are actually, Board 3 MR. RIVERO: 4 Members. The parties have an Offer in Compromise 5 to present to the Board, at this time. The offer consists of a fine of \$1,250 6 7 payable in 30 days. 8 I do want to note something about this 9 Offer in Compromise. It appears that, in this particular case, the Investigator had cited the 10 Licensee. The citation was in the amount of 11 12 \$1,000. The Offer in Compromise before you is 13 \$1,250, which would be normal given the 14 underlying amount in the citation. 15 However, it appears that the 16 investigative history of the establishment was 17 misread and so -- however, ethical obligations 18 require us to, once we provide an Offer in 19 Compromise, stick to it. It's not -- we cannot 20 retract it. 21 And so for that reason, we maintain 22 the offer in front of the Board, number one.

Number two, I have discussed the			
underlying violation with the Licensee, because			
the Licensee does have a history of having not			
filed a quarterly statement on time. And we have			
come to an agreement on a system whereby this			
won't happen again.			
So he is to immediately email the			
compliance specialist upon filing to ensure that			
any question about a malfunction of the system is			
eliminated by having an immediate confirmation			
from the compliance specialist. And if one is			
not forthcoming, he will simply walk in and file			
it in person.			
So with that in mind, it's also the			
Government's view that this Offer in Compromise			
does present an efficient use of Government			
resources in terms of avoiding a hearing, because			
this would not be an actual short hearing, since			
there would be a lot of			
MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I'm sorry,			
because there should not be?			
MR. RIVERO: It wouldn't be a short			

1	hearing. There would be a lot of information to			
2	technical information to present about how the			
3	system works. And so I do believe that the Offer			
4	in Compromise is a good resolution, given where			
5	we are.			
6	Naturally, I would not have the			
7	offer would not have been extended had there			
8	had the citation properly been fined, but because			
9	we are here and I believe that I'm ethically-			
10	bound to stick with the in other words, it's			
11	the Government's error. And the Licensee			
12	shouldn't be punished because of the Government's			
13	error.			
14	That's what I wanted to say about the			
15	particular offer.			
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, your			
17	name again, sir? Mister?			
18	MR. JEBLONSKI: Gayner Jeblonski.			
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mister?			
20	MR. JEBLONSKI: Jeblonski.			
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Jeblonski.			
22	Now, oh, Mr. Rivero, so has the quarterly

statement been filed? 1 2 MR. RIVERO: Um, I think --MR. JEBLONSKI: 3 Yes. 4 MR. RIVERO: -- so. 5 Yes, we have. MR. JEBLONSKI: CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 6 Okay. I'm 7 getting confirmation that the statement was 8 filed. Okay. 9 MR. JEBLONSKI: Yes, sir. I'm going to satisfy 10 MR. RIVERO: myself after the hearing and if it --11 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I think I --MR. RIVERO: -- if there is any 13 14 question about it, I'll make sure that I resolve 15 it with the Licensee. 16 MEMBER SHORT: They have --17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I got a yes 18 from a staff member in the audience, a shaking of 19 the head. That is a staff member of the Agency kind of shook their head to say it was filed. 20 Then I take it that it was filed. 21 22 Mr. Jeblonski, it's my understanding

1 that there is an Offer in Compromise. There is--2 that there is a fine of \$1,250 payable in 30 If the fine is not paid within 30 days, 3 days. 4 the license will be suspended as -- until payment 5 has been made. Is this your understanding, sir, of 6 7 the Offer in Compromise? 8 Yes, it is. MR. JEBLONSKI: 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you aware that by accepting an Offer in Compromise, that 10 you are giving up your right to a hearing? 11 12 MR. JEBLONSKI: I do. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you also 14 aware that by accepting this Offer in Compromise, 15 that you are giving up your right to appeal this 16 matter? 17 MR. JEBLONSKI: I do. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I then make a 19 motion that the Offer in Compromise of a fine of 20 \$1,250 be accepted. Is there a second? 21 MEMBER SHORT: Second. 22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has

1 seconded the motion. Any questions by any Board 2 Members? All those in favor of the Offer in 3 4 Compromise say aye. 5 MEMBER SHORT: Aye. 6 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Aye. 7 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Aye. 8 MEMBER ISAAC: Aye. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All those opposed? 10 11 MEMBER ALBERTI: Opposed. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The matter passed 5-1 with Mr. Alberti in opposition. 13 14 MEMBER ALBERTI: 4-1. 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry? I'm 16 sorry? 17 4-1. MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Oh, I didn't 19 hear you, Mr. Silverstein. The matter passed 4-2 with Mr. --20 21 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: 4-1. 22 MEMBER SHORT: 4-1.
