3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Our next is a
4 fact-finding hearing, Case No. 19-251-00108.
5 Will the parties please approach. Will the
6 parties please identify themselves for the
7 record, please. We'll start with, I'll start
8 with the Investigator.

9 INVESTIGATOR MILLER: Investigator
10 Javon Miller.

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Miller.

12 INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: Investigator
13 Mark Brashears.

14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Brashears.

15 MS. YOHANNES: Good afternoon, Sidon
16 Yohannes, Counsel for the licensee.

17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Yohannes,
18 good afternoon.

19 MR. LONG: Sheldon Long.

20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who are you,
21 Mr. Long?

22 MR. LONG: I'm the General Manager of
23 the establishment.

24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, who else
25 do we have?

1 MR. EPPS: Kalen Epps, head of
2 security at the establishment.

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Epps.

4 MR. KARAGOUNIS: I'm Tony Karagounis.

5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Karagounis.

6 MR. KARAGOUNIS: Yes, owner of the
7 establishment.

8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, sir.

9 MR. MARMEROUS: Dmitrius Marmerous,
10 part-owner of the establishment.

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Marmerous.

12 And maybe if I'm out of line I'm going to say
13 this, but Ms. Yohannes, are all of the owners on
14 this license?

15 MS. YOHANNES: Are?

16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The owners who
17 have identified themselves today as owners of the
18 establishment, are they on this license? And the
19 reason why I'm asking, Ms., and this is just an
20 educational, educating the parties. So I had a
21 hearing, was it last week?

22 MEMBER SHORT: Last week.

23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And I had a
24 gentleman in the audience who identified himself
25 as an owner, as a significant owner of an

1 establishment, and he didn't, he was not on the
2 license. And because there were some other
3 issues that went on and folks had to straighten
4 the ownership, so this owner had to identify
5 himself.

6 So I don't know, I've not looked at
7 the documentation, but I would just ask you that
8 since we have parties here who have identified
9 themselves as owner, an owner of the
10 establishment, to make sure that all owners who,
11 as you are aware, if the person owns more than
12 ten percent of the establishment, that their name
13 is on the license.

14 And one of the reasons why I said that
15 because, and I should know his name by now, Mr.
16 Scara --

17 MR. KARAGOUNIS: Karagounis.

18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry?

19 MR. KARAGOUNIS: Karagounis.

20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Karagounis.

21 And I should, I had so much practice before that
22 it should just roll off my tongue, but it's not.
23 But since he's here, and based on the discussion
24 that we had, he said I didn't know, I didn't
25 know, I did not know, I didn't know.

1 So I want to make sure that you know,
2 as the attorney, to make sure that you look at
3 the ownership, that at least the ABRA paperwork
4 to see the folks who are identified as owners and
5 to make sure that these individuals who
6 identified themselves publically as owners that
7 they are on our paperwork, okay?

8 MS. YOHANNES: Understood, yes.

9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Again, it has
10 nothing to do with this case, but this is just
11 public information to make sure that folks say
12 they don't know, so I'm putting it out there so
13 if they didn't know before, that they now are on
14 notice.

15 All right. Mr. Miller, can you just
16 give us some background information about this
17 case and how you're familiar with this facility,
18 sir.

19 INVESTIGATOR MILLER: I was assigned
20 this case.

21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You can just
22 pull the microphone over to you so you can be
23 comfortable speaking, sir.

24 INVESTIGATOR MILLER: I was assigned
25 this case as far as the assault with a deadly

1 weapon for Ultrabar. That investigation
2 initiated as a result of a telephone call to ABRA
3 hotline from MPD Saturday, June 22, 2019. As an
4 assault with a deadly weapon took place inside
5 the Ultrabar.

6 A male patron was struck in the head
7 and back multiple times with a steel stanchion
8 by another unknown male patron. As a result, the
9 victim bled profusely. The suspect was arrested
10 and the victim was transported to George
11 Washington University Hospital.

12 I spoke with MPD Officer Thermidor on
13 the incident. He stated that he was informed by
14 security personnel that a physical altercation
15 inside the establishment happened between six
16 male patrons. There was a three-on-three fight
17 on the penthouse floor of the establishment.

18 Officer Thermidor stated when Security
19 brought suspects outside the establishment,
20 Security notified him of a victim being injured.
21 He asked to hold the patrons that were escorted
22 out. Security personnel did aid the victim until
23 emergency responders arrived.

24 In addition, Security notified Officer
25 Thermidor that the suspect, who was wearing a red

1 baseball cap with, was swinging a gold stanchion,
2 and the victim was struck by a suspect 1 in the
3 head and back. Officer Thermidor stated that the
4 suspect was identified and interviewed. The
5 suspect admitted that he struck the victim to
6 protect his brother, who was assaulted by the
7 victim.

8 Officer Thermidor stated that he then
9 placed the victim under arrest. I also spoke
10 with the ABC Manager, Mr. Long, and the head of
11 Security, Mr. Epps. Both of their stories
12 matched Officer Thermidor's earlier statements.

13 On Sunday, June 23, 2019, I visited
14 Ultrabar to conduct a regulatory inspection, pick
15 up incident report, and obtain video footage.
16 Ultrabar did cooperate by providing the
17 information I needed for the report. No ABRA
18 violations occurred during the regulatory
19 inspection.

20 Ultrabar has a security plan. Upon
21 reviewing the security plan, no security plan
22 violations occurred. Ultrabar does not have a
23 settlement agreement. Ultrabar was cooperative
24 with MPD and myself during the incident and
25 investigation.

1 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, Ms.
2 Yohannes, how do you, or how did your client
3 respond to this incident?

4 MS. YOHANNES: Well, our client's
5 position here is that, I mean, as the
6 Investigator stated, the staff, Security
7 personnel cooperated with the Investigator,
8 cooperated with MPD. They notified officers of
9 the incident, helped to identify the suspects,
10 de-escalated the situation, followed the security
11 plan and protocol.

12 This was a bad situation that
13 occurred, it was unfortunate. But staff did as
14 they were supposed to do. And we're happy to
15 answer any questions, but in terms of violations,
16 we feel like we did everything we were supposed
17 to do in that situation to identify what was
18 going on and to help the victim after it
19 happened, and to help the investigators and
20 officers after as well.

21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So how quickly,
22 how quickly did the Security of the establishment
23 respond to this incident?

24 MS. YOHANNES: Immediately. So, and
25 you can speak because you were there. Do you

1 want to speak --

2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You can
3 identify yourself for the record before you
4 speak, sir.

5 MR. LONG: Sheldon Long, the General
6 Manager. I did not personally witness the
7 incident. A Security Manager was there. From
8 the time the fight started to the time we
9 interjected, I'd say ten seconds maybe. Mr.
10 Epps, you know, dispersed the clients. And we
11 have security that were helping guide the victim.

12 And we had another set of security
13 escorting the more aggressive party outside. We
14 already identified who the assailant was and MPD
15 was already on the way up. And they, everybody,
16 they intercepted them and brought them outside.
17 And we helped the victim in the back area,
18 towards security.

19 And we called the MPD and let them
20 know. And we called the ambulance, and they
21 attended to him for a couple minutes before -- he
22 at first didn't really want to go. But
23 eventually he left with them, they went to the
24 hospital.

25 MS. YOHANNES: The crime scene was

1 preserved immediately, and you can see from the
2 report and the Investigator's review of the
3 camera surveillance footage that within ten
4 minutes of the time that the altercation occurred
5 to the time that Security escorted the suspects
6 out of the establishment, it was only ten
7 minutes.

8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I mean, it's
9 not related, I'm just looking at the
10 investigative history over the last, since
11 between January 9, 2016 and March 3, 2018, we
12 happened to have a lot of assault at this place.
13 I mean, what's it all about?

14 I mean, what's going on there that
15 there's one, two, three, four, five, six, seven,
16 eight, eight -- I mean, and yes, there's been
17 NFAs, but why are we having so many assaults at
18 this place? I know folks will come and we can't,
19 you, folks will come and things happen. But
20 it's, I'm not really seeing this as a place where
21 there's all these assaults.

22 MS. YOHANNES: I can't speak to the
23 specific situations that occurred in every
24 specific case. But you know, as you stated, no
25 further action was taken in each case. There is

1 a security plan in place at the establishment and
2 their security is trained.

3 They follow what's in the security
4 plan and they're taking steps to try to ensure
5 that if a, you know, if there is some sort of
6 confrontation or there's a fight that occurs,
7 they do their best to intervene as quickly as
8 possible, de-escalate, and to make sure that, you
9 know, it doesn't happen, that people are not
10 injured.

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, what was
12 the object that was used, that was utilized in
13 this particular case?

14 MS. YOHANNES: A stanchion.

15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What is that?

16 MR. LONG: It's a stanchion, it holds
17 the ropes. It's like a barrier.

18 PARTICIPANT: Like a metal pole.

19 PARTICIPANT: It's like a metal pole.

20 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: It's a picture,
21 Exhibit 4.

22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But how -- oh,
23 you can separate the, you can take off the rope
24 off of it. All right, any questions by any other
25 members. Yes, Mr. Short.

1 MEMBER SHORT: This is to the General
2 Manager. How many staff do you have there?

3 MR. LONG: Security staff, twenty-two,
4 twenty-two.

5 MEMBER SHORT: Twenty-two.

6 MR. LONG: Yes.

7 MEMBER SHORT: Are they all trained?

8 MR. LONG: Yes, they are.

9 MEMBER SHORT: Who trained them?

10 MR. LONG: Kalen trains them, and
11 another Security Manager, Tony Barnes, has been
12 there from inception. And he trains them as
13 well.

14 MEMBER SHORT: Okay, what training
15 does the trainer have?

16 MR. EPPS: Well, I've been certified
17 by, his name Robert, Robert, he does nationwide
18 security training.

19 MS. YOHANNES: Robert Smith.

20 MR. EPPS: Robert Smith, yes. He does
21 nationwide security training and I have
22 certification. And I use that, as well as my
23 experience. I've been working here about five or
24 six years at Ultrabar.

25 MEMBER SHORT: Okay, so all 22 of your

1 security staff, have they been trained, and what
2 standard have they been trained by?

3 MR. EPPS: Well, they're trained by
4 myself. I pass the information along. I can't
5 say that they are all being certified, but a
6 number of them have been certified. And I pass
7 that information along. I do training every
8 Friday, after roll call we do a training session
9 every --

10 MEMBER SHORT: Every week? Sounds
11 great. But again, as the Chairman said, there's
12 a lot of violence going on there. So I don't
13 know what I can say to you. But let me ask you
14 this, when the incident occurred, were you there
15 that night?

16 MR. EPPS: Yes, I sir, I dealt with it
17 personally. Yes, sir, I dealt with it
18 personally.

19 MEMBER SHORT: How many floors in the
20 establishment?

21 MR. EPPS: Four.

22 MEMBER SHORT: Which floor did this
23 incident occur on?

24 MR. EPPS: The top floor.

25 MEMBER SHORT: Fourth floor.

1 MR. EPPS: Yes, sir.

2 MEMBER SHORT: Okay, when the incident
3 happened, did you stop serving alcohol, did you
4 cut the lights up, cut the music off?

5 MR. EPPS: When I found out that there
6 was a crime had occurred, yes, I called for them
7 to cut the lights and cut the music.

8 MEMBER SHORT: So the other 22 that
9 are trained, they didn't, they were waiting for
10 you to do that, or?

11 MR. EPPS: Well, they heard my call on
12 the radio.

13 MEMBER SHORT: So if they can't get
14 you on the radio, they just keep moving until
15 they hear you on the radio, or?

16 MR. EPPS: No, if one of my security
17 would have witnessed a crime they would have let
18 me know a crime occurred and I would have made
19 that call myself.

20 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Now, the other
21 three floors after the incident occurred, did
22 they stop serving alcohol or just kept on? Or
23 what happened?

24 MR. EPPS: Well, we preserved the
25 crime scene immediately, you know. As soon as I

1 found out it was a crime, we shut it down. And
2 then shut, the General Manager made a call to
3 shut it --

4 MEMBER SHORT: A lot of blood, it's
5 the testimony then, there was a lot of blood,
6 correct?

7 MR. EPPS: There was a quite amount of
8 blood, yes.

9 MEMBER SHORT: Head injuries cause a
10 lot of bleeding, a lot of bleeding. And hit with
11 a metal pole I would imagine was a lot of trauma.
12 Just to say so how did you bring him down from
13 the fourth floor to the ambulance, or did the
14 ambulance come upstairs and get him?

15 MR. EPPS: We, I escorted, when I went
16 outside, once I took the violent party out first,
17 and the ambulance got there, I took them up
18 through the back stairwell, which is a little
19 more accessible, and it goes directly up to the
20 back kitchen area, where we had the victim.

21 MEMBER SHORT: So you moved him from
22 the fourth floor down to the first floor?

23 MR. EPPS: No, no, no, he remained on
24 the fourth floor.

25 MEMBER SHORT: Okay, good, okay, good.

1 MR. EPPS: So the paramedics were able
2 to get through the back stairwell, where I
3 ushered them.

4 MEMBER SHORT: Thank you, that's all
5 I have. Thank you very much.

6 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any other
7 questions from any other Board members? And Mr.
8 Miller, you're saying that the establishment, you
9 did not see any ABRA violations?

10 INVESTIGATOR MILLER: No, sir, they
11 followed their security plan and they did a, they
12 get to the incident pretty fast during the video
13 footage, so.

14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And they were
15 cooperative with ABRA?

16 INVESTIGATOR MILLER: Yes, sir.

17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any final
18 comments you want to make, Ms. Yohannes?

19 MS. YOHANNES: No, I think that's all.

20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Once again,
21 I'll make a recommendation to the Board that we
22 take no further action in this matter. Is there
23 a second?

24 MEMBER SHORT: Second.

25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has

1 seconded the motion. All those favor, say ayes.

2 (Chorus of ayes.)

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The Board will
4 take no further action, but we shouldn't have all
5 these assaults at the establishment and we need
6 to figure out some way how to prevent it. I
7 don't know the clientele or the crowd that goes
8 to the establishment, but, and of course we can't
9 prevent.

10 But now the establishment is aware
11 that these stanchions can be utilized as weapons,
12 so maybe we need to keep that in mind in their
13 placement. And I'm not quite sure if, how many
14 are in the establishment and if -- how large is
15 this establishment?

16 MR. KARAGOUNIS: It's about 10,000
17 square feet.

18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you have 22
19 security guards?

20 MR. KARAGOUNIS: Yes. The usable
21 space is much less than that, though.

22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But I'm just
23 saying then now that you're aware that stanchions
24 can be utilized as a weapon, then maybe this
25 needs to be, I'm not saying be removed, because

1 of course they can't be removed. But your
2 security needs to be aware that this is now a
3 potential weapon and try to figure out how to
4 prevent this from being used as a weapon.

5 Yes, Mr. Cato.

6 MEMBER CATO: Quick question. So a
7 rope and stanchion, that's specifically for a VIP
8 section, right? So it's a very small section?
9 Okay, all right.

10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
11 Thank you for being here, have a great day.
