**ORDER VACATING CANCELLATION OF LICENSE AND
REINSTATING LICENSE**

On March 6, 2019, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) cancelled the Retailer's Class CR License ABRA-101295 held by Uni Corporation, t/a Uni Bistro (Petitioner), because the Petitioner had ceased operations. *See* Board Order No. 2019-116.

On March 25, 2019, Aibly Getahun, on behalf of the Petitioner sought reinstatement of the Retailer's Class CR License ABRA-101295. In support of his Request for Reinstatement, Mr. Getahun stated he has a completed Transfer Application pending with the Board; and he intends to transfer the license once it is reinstated.

The Board finds that the reinstatement of the license is proper.

Accordingly, it is this 3rd day of April, 2019, **ORDERED** that the **ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE** issued against Uni Corporation, t/a Uni Bistro, by the Board on March 6, 2019, be and hereby is **VACATED**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Retailer's Class CR License ABRA-101295 be **REINSTATED**.





Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
