## ORDER AFFIRMING BOARD ORDER NO. 2019-033

## INTRODUCTION

In Board Order No. 2019-033, which the Board issued on January 16, 2019, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board found compelling evidence that the former ownership of Mesobe Restaurant and Deli Market engaged in or permitted the illegal service and consumption of alcohol at 1853 7th Street, N.W., on January 6, 2019, in violation of D.C. Official Code § 25-102. In addition, the Board was presented with compelling evidence that this activity constituted a nuisance under D.C. Official Code § 25-805. Therefore, under the authority granted by D.C. Official Code § 25-791, the Board ordered the prior owner of Mesobe and the landlord to cease the sale, service, distribution, and consumption of alcohol at the premises and barred the issuance of temporary and one-day substantial change licenses at the premises. After a request for a hearing was received, the Board held a hearing on April 10, 2019, to review the Order and hear objections. Nevertheless, none of the arguments and evidence presented at the hearing persuaded the Board that its prior Order was inappropriate or unreasonable.

## **ORDER**

Therefore, the Board, on this 24th day of April 2019, hereby **AFFIRMS** Board Order No. 2019-033, which shall remain in full force and effect. A copy of this Order shall be provided to the Parties.
