## ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE IN SAFEKEEPING

The Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Administration (ABCA) has reviewed its records and determined that Via Umbria, LLC, t/a Via Umbria's (Respondent) license is currently in safekeeping.

On April 5, 2023, the ABCA's Licensing Division provided a written notice to the Respondent notifying the Respondent that the safekeeping period for its license expired on September 30, 2023. The Respondent was further notified that if it wished to keep its license in Safekeeping, a safekeeping extension request must be submitted to the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board (Board) immediately, or the license will be cancelled, pursuant to the District of Columbia Official Code § 25-791(c).

The Respondent failed to request a safekeeping extension for its License No. ABRA-100436 by September 30, 2023.

Also, pursuant to section II of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thilty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion.
