The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in the Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson, presiding.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. The next case on our calendar is Case No. 18-CC00094, Wagshal's, License No. 92730.

Will the parties, please, approach and identify themselves for the record, please?

MS. SCHMIDT: Good morning. Amy Schmidt, Assistant Attorney General on behalf of the District of Columbia.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, again, Ms. Schmidt.

MS. SALGUERO: Good morning, Members of the Board. My name is Rosemarie Salguero from Greenberg Traurig and I am representing Wagshal's.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I did not hear your last name, ma'am.

MS. SALGUERO: Salguero, S, as in Sam, A-L-G-U-E-R-O.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning again, Ms. Salguero.

MS. SALGUERO: Good morning.
MR. FUCHS: And my name is William Fuchs. Good morning.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, Mr. Fuchs.

MR. FUCHS: I'm the owner of Wagshal's.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning.
Ms. Schmidt, are there any preliminary matters in this case?

MS. SCHMIDT: Yes, there is, there are. There is an Offer in Compromise consisting of a \$4,000 --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on, hold on, hold on one minute, please. This appears to be long, so let me make sure. Go ahead.

MS. SCHMIDT: For Charge 1, there is a $\$ 4,000$ fine which can be paid today, I'm told, and the license shall be suspended for 10 days. Now, we'll just figure out the logistics. If it could start this Friday?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We're going to
issue a Board Order, but they -- can you tell me, give me the dates.

MS. SCHMIDT: Okay. January 11 through 19th.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: January the 11th through what?

MS. SCHMIDT: The 19th.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, um-hum, what else?

MS. SCHMIDT: Oh, well, that's going to be the -- let me just clarify. The license will be suspended for 10 days with six days stayed for one year and four days to be served. So the first four days of that goes to that.

And then in addition, the respondent
shall serve five days activated from Case No. 17-CC-0089, that's how he gets the 19th.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay.
MS. SCHMIDT: And then all employees who serve alcoholic beverages in the licensed establishment shall complete alcohol training within three months from the OIC's date.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay.
MS. SCHMIDT: And with respect to Charge 2, there is a mandatory warning. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's it? That's it?

MS. SCHMIDT: That's it.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Ms. Salguero, it's my understanding that there is an Offer in Compromise. And the Offer in Compromise is that for Charge 1, there is a fine of $\$ 4,000$ and it's my understanding that the fine will be paid today. And if the fine is not paid today, the license will be suspended until the fine has been paid.

And secondly that the license shall be suspended for 10 days with six days stayed for one year and four days to be served. That all employees who serve alcoholic beverages in the licensed establishment shall complete an alcohol training within three months from the date of the OIC.
serve five days that were activated from Case No. 17-CC-00089.

For Charge 2, that there is a mandatory warning.

So total that the -- will be a 9-day suspension and six days stayed and the days that the suspension are in effect are from January the 11th through January 19, 2019.

Is this your understanding of the Offer in Compromise?

MS. SALGUERO: It is our
understanding, except $I$ have one clarification and I spoke with Ms. Schmidt's colleague just Wagshal's has a B/D License and they, you know, have the grocery side and then they have a small deli. And we just want to confirm that the suspension is for the $B$ side and the $D$ side, which is a small deli, you know, sit-down, that they will still be able to use that side of the license. And I apologize, I forgot to bring that up.

MS. SCHMIDT: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You guys need to tell me what -- this is a B License, because from -- I'm looking at this is on -- for License No. 92730.

MS. SALGUERO: The sale to minor did occur on the $B$ side of the license.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right.
MS. SALGUERO: So I just want --
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yeah.
MS. SALGUERO: -- we want to make sure that that's --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right.
MS. SALGUERO: -- the side of the
license that would be --
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right.
MS. SALGUERO: -- suspended.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So this is on the 92730 License.

MS. SCHMIDT: That's what your
understanding is?
MS. SALGUERO: So then the suspension would apply to both the $B$ and the $D$ side?

MS. SCHMIDT: As far as alcohol goes. MS. SALGUERO: Because they are able to have currently in their dining side, you know, bring the drinks to, you know, whoever is dining. MR. FUCHS: It's just beer and wine. MS. SALGUERO: It's just beer and wine. It's not, you know, on the other side.

MR. FUCHS: Yeah.
MS. SALGUERO: On the grocery side, we also sell beer and wine.

MR. FUCHS: Yes, right.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you are saying you have a B and a D?

MS. SALGUERO: Yeah, it's one of those hybrid licenses that permits, you know, a few -you know, there is only a few of them where there is a grocery, you know, store with a small dining inside, so --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. The infraction occurred on the $B$ side and so, therefore, it's the B License that is being suspended.

MS. SALGUERO: Okay.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And so it does not impact the $D$ that you have. It's just the B License.

MS. SALGUERO: Okay.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So with that clarification, is this your understanding of the Offer in Compromise?

MS. SALGUERO: It is our understanding and I believe that also Mr. Fuchs just wanted to make known that he has made several steps to try to, you know, train his staff. He has card readers. He goes through extensive training. He has secret shoppers, you know, that go in and test his staff, that he has them sign, you know, basically waivers saying, you know, we understand all of the procedures.

So he, you know, has tried to -- he is very upset that this has occurred on the second time. He just wanted to communicate that to the Board as to the fact that he is undertaking quite a number of steps at the establishment to make
sure this does not happen again.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Thank you for that representation. All right.

With that said, $I$ make a motion that the Offer in Compromise be accepted. The Offer in Compromise is that for Charge 1, that there is a $\$ 4,000$ fine payable within -- payable today. If it's not payable today, the license will be suspended indefinitely until the fine is paid. That the license shall be -- that the B License shall be suspended for 10 days with six days stayed for one year and four days to be served. That all employees who serve alcoholic beverages in the licensed establishment complete an alcohol training program within three months from the date of the OIC.

And in addition, the respondent shall serve five days that were activated from Case No. 17-CC-00089.

For Charge 2, the -- a mandatory warning will be issued.

So in this particular case, there are
a total of 9 days suspension and the 9 days suspension on the $B$ License will be from January the 11th through January 19, 2019. And six days will be stayed for a year provided that no further infractions are -- occurs on the B License within the year.

Is there a second?
MEMBER SHORT: Second.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has seconded the motion.

All those in favor say aye.
ALL: Aye.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Those opposed? The matter passes 5-0-0.

I want to thank all the parties for doing this Offer in Compromise. And we will issue an order.

I just want to say, Mr. Fuchs, I appreciate the representation that was made by your attorney, but $I$ also would like to point out to you that the Board takes serving to minor very important and you are -- you have now committed
two violations and if you get to four, it's a $\$ 30,000$ fine or you could lose your license. And that's not nothing, it's not -- and it's not negotiable. That's what the statute says.

So I am not here endorsing Costco, but everyone who goes to Costco no matter what they look like, no matter how old they are, before they sell alcohol, they have to prove their age, sir. And you need to do that, because although your employees might do it, you can fire them and they can go find another job.

But if this is your livelihood, you could lose your license. And as I said before, because of the graduated fines, you can come and represent, but the regulation says $\$ 30,000$ fine or you lose your license. And there is nothing we can do.

So you have to do -- you are the only one we can hold accountable, so you need to take the measures to make sure that you maintain your business, sir. All right?

MR. FUCHS: I appreciate the Board's
understanding and I am -- I believe that, you know, the world was probably built on good intentions, but that's not getting it done. So we understand the severity and understand that we have to be -- double our efforts to --

## CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Sure. Because

 at the end of the day, you are the one who is going to -- the employees will come and go, but this is your livelihood and if you want to maintain your livelihood, you need to do what you need to do to make sure that your livelihood survives.MR. FUCHS: I understand. Thank you.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
Have a great day. Thank you.
MS. SCHMIDT: Thank you.
