CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, everyone. I would like to welcome you to the regularly scheduled meeting of the District of Columbia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

Please know that today's hearings will be conducted in accordance with D.C. Official Code Section 2-574 of the Open Meetings Act.

Today is July 10, 2019. I would first like to introduce Members of the Board with us today.

To my right is Mr. Bobby Cato, to my left is Mr. Mike Silverstein, and to my immediate left is Mr. James Short. My name is Donovan Anderson and I'm Chairman of the Board. We have four Members in attendance today and so, therefore, we have a quorum to conduct business.

I would like to mention two things before we get started. First of all, if you have any electronic devices, pagers, cell phones or such, please, make certain that they are turned off to avoid any interruption of the proceedings.

1	Secondly, there is a piece of paper on
2	each table. When you come forward as your case
3	is called, please, take a seat at the table and,
4	please, sign-in. This is to ensure the correct
5	spelling of your name for the record.
6	Additionally, when you introduce
7	yourself for the record, please, spell your name
8	aloud for the court reporter.
9	I would note that the approximate time
10	is 9:34 a.m. and our first order of business
11	today is a Protest Hearing (Status), Case No. 19-
12	PRO-00032, The Watergate Hotel, License No.
13	91162.
14	Would all parties with this matter,
15	please, step forward and identify yourself for
16	the record, please?
17	MR. MINORA: Matthew Minora, ABC-
18	licensed counsel.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on a
20	minute, Mr. Minora.
21	MR. MINORA: I'm sorry.
22	(Bangs gavel)

	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you guys
2	coming up or not? If this is your case, come
3	forward. If you are the protestants and the ANC
4	in this case, come forward. This matter is being
5	protested, it's my understanding, by ANC-2A and a
6	Group of Five or More. So if you are a part of
7	it, everyone needs to come up and pull a seat.
8	MR. SMITH: Mr. Chairman, does that
9	include all the protesters or just the leader?
10	MS. BARBISCH: The Group of Five?
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: For the Group
12	of Five or More, I need it's my understanding
13	that well, let me not start there. So
14	everyone who is here today for this matter, come
15	forward. So if you are involved in this, pull up
16	a chair and come forward, please.
17	Yes, Mr. Minora?
18	MR. MINORA: Matthew Minora from the
19	Law Firm of Mallios & O'Brien, ABC-licensed
20	counsel for the applicant.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,

6	MS. WALKER: I'm sorry?
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: It's correct
8	that you were not at the Roll Call Hearing? Is
9	that correct?
10	MS. WALKER: Correct.
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. All
12	right.
13	MS. BARBISCH: And, sir, I was not at
14	the Roll Call either.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Your name
16	again, ma'am?
17	MS. BARBISCH: I'm sorry?
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Your name
19	again, please?
20	MS. BARBISCH: Barbisch.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Barbisch.
22	MS. BARBISCH: B-A-R-B-I-S-C-H.

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. All
2	right. All right. It's my understanding that
3	the Group of Five or More was granted conditional
4	standing at the Roll Call Hearing. And because I
5	think only four members were present and today
6	there are two members of the Group of Five or
7	More who were not at the Roll Call Hearing.
8	MS. BARBISCH: Let me - a point of
9	clarification. Cynthia Walker was not part of
10	the Gang of Five. I was the only one that was
11	not here for the Roll Call on the Gang of Five.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
13	Well, you only need one person, so
14	MS. BARBISCH: All right.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: and so since
16	you are now here and you were not at the Roll
17	Call Hearing, then the Board will grant standing
18	to the Group of Five or More. Okay. So granting
19	standing has been granted.
20	I just also want to just clarify to
21	the Group of Five or More that if a settlement
22	agreement is reached by the ANC, whether or not

the Group of Five or More, whether or not they are or are not a part of the settlement agreement, they fall.

And the Board is in no position to force an ANC to have a group become a party to an agreement. I just want that -- that's just the way it is. So I just want you to be -- to know that, because we have had cases where a Group of Five or More, they are petitioning the Board to say that we want to be a part of the agreement and the Board has no authority to force you to be a part of that agreement.

So as long as you know that at any point if the Agency signs a settlement agreement, then the group falls. Okay. All right.

Are there any other preliminary matters in this case?

All right. This matter is then scheduled for a Protest Hearing on August 7, 2019 at 1:30 p.m.

Have you guys been to a Protest
Hearing before or do you want me to read the

instructions or are you familiar with the process?

MR. SMITH: I think reading the instructions would be helpful.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. All right. Now that we have scheduled this matter for a Protest Hearing, there are a few things that I would like to instruct the applicant and the protestants about, so that the Protest Hearing is focused and addresses only those issues that are being protested. The Board does not intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to this case.

You should have received by electronic or regular mail a letter explaining the protest process, a copy of the Protest Information Form and a copy of the Exhibit Form. If you do not have these documents, please, contact Assistant General Counsel April Randall following this hearing.

It is imperative that you review the rules closely and that you follow them before and

during the Protest Hearing. You are also required to complete and submit the Protest Information Form (PIF) and the Exhibit Form seven days before the date of the hearing. These two forms and accompanying documents need to be submitted to ABRA's Legal Division and to all opposing parties in this matter.

If we do not receive a copy of your PIF, your application or your protest, whichever side you are representing, may be subject to dismissal. Likewise, if we do not receive a copy of the Exhibit Form and the exhibits themselves, your exhibits may be excluded from the record upon a finding that the opposing party has been prejudiced or no good cause for the failure to submit has been shown.

Likewise witnesses other than a party may also be subject to exclusion if not identified in the PIF.

Accordingly, these forms are very important as they greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the

process and keeping the parties on point during the hearing. They likewise provide notice to the opposing parties enabling them to better prepare for the hearing.

I support and always tell the parties that I support settlement agreements. And the reason why, I'm not telling you it has to be settled, but the reason why when I said I support settlement agreements is because this is your community and you can, by having a settlement agreement, determine what goes on in your community, because none of us live in this area.

And so if the Board has to make a decision, you might not be happy with the decision. One side is going to be happy, one side is going to be -- is not going to be happy or vice versa. Maybe no one is happy with

whatever decision is made by the Board.

So I prefer if you can settle it, but if not, I will see you on August 7th at 1:30.

MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Mr. Chairman?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr.

Silverstein? Please, everyone sign-in on the sign-in sheet before you leave.

Go ahead, Mr. Silverstein.

MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Thank you all for being here. I would echo all the words of our Chairman. And I would also add that we do hope that you do come to a settlement agreement for our own selfish reasons that we have a very limited staff, that we have a limited amount of time that we are -- most importantly, we are in the midst of renewal season.

There are over 1,000 licenses that are being renewed. There are many that are being protested in order to get settlement agreements.

Some are being protested because there are intractable differences.

If this is one of those cases where it can be settled, the sooner the better for us.

Our staff in every Protest Hearing puts together a Protest Report. It's a booklet that is about 50 pages and it takes an enormous amount of time.

And our people can be out doing enforcement work and doing other things as well.

so if we all work together and it appears that you can have a settlement and by no means am I leaning on you to do so, but if you can, the sooner the better. It will be a much better use of our resources, of our people to ensure the peace, order and quiet and public safety of the city. Thank you very much.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Thank you, Mr. Silverstein. And I fully agree with what he said, but I'll just say to you that even if you show up for the protest hearing and you decide at that moment that you want to settle it, it is not a problem. I support that. So I just wanted you to know that.
