CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, everyone. I would like to welcome you to the regularly scheduled meeting of the District of Columbia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

Please know that today's hearings will be conducted in accordance with D.C. Official Code Section 2-574 of the Open Meetings Act.

Today is December 12, 2018. I would first like to introduce Members of the Board with us today. To my far right is Mr. Bobby Cato. To my immediate right is Mr. Nick Alberti. To my far left is Ms. Rema Wahabzadah. To her right is Mr. Mike Silverstein. My name is Donovan Anderson. I'm Chairman of the Board. We have five Members in attendance today. We do have a quorum to conduct business.

I would like to mention two things before we get started. First of all, if you have any electronic devices, pagers, cell phones or such, please, make certain that they are turned

off to avoid any interruption of the proceedings. 1 2 Secondly, there is a piece of paper on each table. When you come forward as your case 3 is called, please, take a seat at the table and, 4 please, sign-in. This is to ensure the correct 5 spelling of your name for the record. 6 7 Additionally, when you introduce 8 yourself for the record, please, spell your name 9 aloud for the court reporter. I would note that the approximate time 10 is 9:43 a.m. 11 12 The first order of business today is 13 a Protest Hearing (Status), Case No. 18-PRO-14 00077, To Be Determined, License No. 111311. Will the parties, please, approach and identify 15 16 themselves for the record, please? 17 MS. HARMON: Hello. I'm Florence 18 Harmon, ANC-2A Commissioner. As you know or you 19 may not know, the Commissioner for this SMD 20 passed away, so I'm helping out with it. And I'm 21 representing ANC-2A.

2	MR. LEIBOW: I'm Philip Leibow. I'm
3	the president of the Westlake Association
4	Condominium and I believe part of the group is on
5	the complaint.
6	MS. HARMON: Yeah, he is the
7	representative for the Group of Five.
8	MR. LEIBOW: I'm the representative.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You are the
10	representative for the Group of Five. Yes?
11	MS. YOHANNES: Good morning. Sidon
12	Yohannes on behalf of the applicant.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
14	Ms. Yohannes.
15	Are there any preliminary matters or
16	there are no issues in this and standing was
17	given to the Group of Five at the Roll Call?
18	MS. YOHANNES: There are no issues.
19	We hope to get a settlement agreement to you
20	shortly.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. All
22	right. This matter is scheduled for a Protest

Hearing on January 16th at 1:30 p.m.

Now that we have scheduled this matter for a Protest Hearing, there are a few things I would like to instruct the applicant and the protestant about, so that the Protest Hearing is focused and addresses only those issues that are being protested.

The Board does not intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to this case. You should have received by electronic or regular mail a letter explaining the protest process, a copy of the Protest Information Form and a copy of the Exhibit Form. If you do not have these documents, please, contact Assistant General Counsel April Randall following this hearing.

It is imperative that you review the rules closely and that you follow them before and during the Protest Hearing. You are also required to complete and submit the Protest Information Form (PIF) and the Exhibit Form seven days before the date of the hearing. These two

forms and accompanying documents need to be submitted to ABRA's Legal Division and to all opposing parties in this matter.

If we do not receive a copy of your PIF, your application or your protest, whichever side you are representing, may be subject to dismissal. Likewise, if we do not receive a copy of the Exhibit Form and the exhibits themselves, your exhibits may be excluded from the record upon a finding that the opposing party has been prejudiced or no good cause for failure to submit has been shown.

Likewise witnesses other than a party may also be subject to exclusion if not identified in the PIF.

Accordingly, these forms are very important as they greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process and keeping the parties on point during the hearing. They likewise provide notice to opposing parties enabling them to better prepare for the hearing.

6	Just as an FYI, I was told that the
7	parties are discussing a settlement and the Board
8	I prefer having settlements, because at least
9	you can determine what is in the best interest of
10	your community, rather than having the Board make
11	that decision for you.
12	I just want to your name again,
13	sir, Mr.?
14	MR. LEIBOW: Philip, Philip.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, your last
16	name.
17	MR. LEIBOW: Leibow.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Leibow, you
19	are representing the group of a group. Is
20	that correct?
21	MR. LEIBOW: Yes.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I just want to

let you know as an FYI that if the ANC signs on a settlement agreement and if you are not a party to it, but if there is a settlement agreement, then you lose out and the Board cannot force them to make you a party of a group.

But sometimes what happens is that the

But sometimes what happens is that the ANC and the licensee come to a settlement agreement. The Group of Five or More is not in agreement and they believe that they can move forward with the hearing, but under the law, if there is a settlement and if you are not part of it, then you fall.

So I hope that if there is an agreement that you are a part of it. We can't force them to make you a party, but just let you know that --

MR. LEIBOW: Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- if you are not part of it, then there is nothing I can do.

MR. LEIBOW: I will be.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I just wanted to let you know that. People come and I'm like

okay, you can't dismiss the protest because we still have issued. I just wanted to let you know that. Okay. All right.

All right. This is -- so I'll also state if I do not see you on January 16, 2019, I will not take it personally, because that will tell me that the parties decided to have a settlement agreement and to do what is in their best interest.

So good luck with your discussions and if I see you in January, I will be happy. If I don't see you, I will be happy. Yes, ma'am?

MS. HARMON: I just want to thank the Board. I'm retiring after 13 years and a lot of you have been here helping me for a long time. I want to thank Fred Moosally and Martha and all the ABRA staff. They have just been fantastic.

And I just have high regard for the staff. They are really talented and have been very, very helpful. So I'll miss seeing you.

Well, maybe I'll see you in another capacity other than a Group of Five, hopefully not.

But I think because of your support over the years, we have developed really good relationships with the Counsels for the licensees. I know I have enjoyed working with Sidon and Andrew Kline and all Manny Mpras and all the other attorneys we have worked with.

And so I think in our ANC we have more of a collaborative relationship with the licensees now and, you know, we don't have the two that were the issue, so you know we are quite -- we really appreciate all your support, all the Investigators who helped us all over and through the years.

So I just wanted to say thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, thank you very much for putting that on the record. And it's good to hear that the Agency is doing the work that it needs to do.

MS. HARMON: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Because we try
to be the type of Agency that is responsive to
the community, responsive to the ANCs and I'm

glad that you put it on the record to say that the Agency has been very responsive to the ANCs and to making this a better process. So thank you very much.

Yes, Mr. Silverstein?

MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Commissioner
Harmon, I want to thank you and on a personal
note, it is beyond the work that you have done
here that you have made a contribution to the
community.

Five or six years ago Francis Stevens School was about to shut down for lack of enrollment. And there would have been no elementary school in the -- in your neighborhood, which is also my neighborhood. And you were one of the leaders, one of the people who fought the hardest to keep the school open and to turn it around.

This year there was a waiting list of over 1,000 for that school. And the work that you have done there, the work that you have done with Ivy Mountain, such as that to provide

1	education for those with disabilities, has been a
2	true gift to the District of Columbia. And I
3	thank you for your service.
4	MS. HARMON: Thank you.
5	MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: And wish you the
6	happiest of holidays and God speed, my friend.
7	MS. HARMON: Thank you. Well, you've
8	got some Court of Appeals decisions, you know. I
9	mean, I think, you know, with the community
10	working with ABRA, you know, I think there are
11	some very significant legal precedent that it
12	will be helpful to the Board and to the staff.
13	So I have really enjoyed working with
14	you all. I know sometimes you wondered, but I
15	really have enjoyed working you all.

17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.
18	MS. HARMON: Thanks.
