3 AGENT FLETCHER: Would the parties in
4 the matter of goPuff, please, come forward? This
5 is Case No. 19-PRO-00001, GoBrands, Inc., 1077
6 30th Street, N.W., License No. ABRA-1011261. This
7 is a Retailer Class A Internet Application. It's
8 a license transfer from 3401 Water Street, N.W.,
9 to 1077 30th Street, N.W.

10 The protest issues are adverse impact
11 on peace, order and quiet; vehicular and
12 pedestrian safety; parking; traffic and real
13 property values.

14 My name is LaVerne Fletcher conducting
15 the Roll Call Hearing as the Board's Agent.

16 Introductions beginning with the
17 applicant, please?

18 MR. O'BRIEN: Stephen O'Brien for the
19 applicant. I'm accompanied by Hadji Maloumian,
20 who is -- what's your title?

21 MR. MALOUMIAN: Associate General
22 Counsel.

1 MR. O'BRIEN: Associate General
2 Counsel.

3 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. It's Archie,
4 right?

5 MR. O'BRIEN: Hadji.

6 MR. MALOUMIAN: Hadji.

7 AGENT FLETCHER: Hadji. Could you
8 spell the first and last name?

9 MR. O'BRIEN: Sure, sure. It's a
10 mouthful. It's H-A-D, as in Daniel, J-I and last
11 name is M, as in Mary, A-L, as in Lewis, O-U-M,
12 as in Mary, I-A-N, as in Nancy.

13 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much.

14 MR. O'BRIEN: You're welcome.

15 AGENT FLETCHER: And present on behalf
16 of the -- let's begin with the Group of 33. Who
17 is present on behalf of the Group of 33?

18 MR. BLANCHARD: Good morning, Ms.
19 Fletcher. Lyle Blanchard for the protestants at
20 -- who reside at 1077.

21 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you. Mr.
22 Blanchard, could you spell your name for the

1 record, please?

2 MR. BLANCHARD: Sure. It's the last
3 name is Blanchard, B-L-A-N-C-H-A-R-D. The first
4 name is Lyle, L-Y-L-E.

5 AGENT FLETCHER: And, Mr. Blanchard,
6 I understand that there are individuals from your
7 group that wanted to sign-in?

8 MR. BLANCHARD: Right. If you want
9 us, I can have them each come up to the
10 microphone and state their name and spell it?

11 AGENT FLETCHER: That's the way we do
12 it.

13 MR. BLANCHARD: Okay.

14 AGENT FLETCHER: And so the only
15 person that needs to sign that sign-in sheet is
16 you.

17 MR. BLANCHARD: Is me? Okay.

18 AGENT FLETCHER: As the designated
19 representative.

20 MR. BLANCHARD: All right.

21 AGENT FLETCHER: So any one from the
22 Group of 33 can just come forward and there is a

1 microphone on the table right beside Mr.
2 Blanchard, if you could state your name into the
3 microphone and spell it for the record, if there
4 is anyone from the Group of 33 represented by Mr.
5 Blanchard.

6 MR. CRIMMINS: Good morning, Ms.
7 Fletcher. I'm one of the protestants. My name
8 is Stephen Crimmins, S-T-E-P-H-E-N Crimmins, C-R-
9 I-M-M-I-N-S. My co-protestant is my spouse,
10 Susan, S-U-S-A-N, Crimmins, C-R-I-M-M-I-N-S. And
11 we live in Unit 509 at James Place.

12 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much.

13 MR. CRIMMINS: Okay.

14 AGENT FLETCHER: Anyone else from the
15 Group of 33 that wants to come forward and you
16 can state your name into the microphone and just
17 spell it for the record.

18 MS. PURI: Hi, good morning. My name
19 is Vandana Puri. It's V, for Victor, A-N-D, for
20 David, A-N-A last name is Puri, P, for Peter, U--

21 AGENT FLETCHER: What's the last name
22 again? I'm sorry.

1 MS. PURI: Puri, P, for Peter, U-R-I.

2 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much.

3 And everybody else can just follow Ms. Puri.

4 Thank you.

5 MS. DICAPUA: My name is Mary-Anne

6 Healy-Dicapua. It's D-I-C-A-P-U-A.

7 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you.

8 MS. TAGER: Good morning, Carolyn

9 Tager, C-A-R-O-L-Y-N T, like in Tom, A-G-E-R,
10 Unit 204.

11 AGENT FLETCHER: T-A-G-E-R?

12 MS. TAGER: T-A-G-E-R.

13 AGENT FLETCHER: That's it?

14 MS. TAGER: Yes.

15 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.

16 MR. DICAPUA: Hello, good morning. My

17 name is Marco Dicapua, M-A-R-C-O last name is

18 Dicapua, D, as in David, I-C, at in cat, A-P, as

19 in Peter, U-A-.

20 AGENT FLETCHER: Can you spell --

21 MR. DICAPUA: I'm in unit --

22 AGENT FLETCHER: -- I'm sorry.

1 MR. DICAPUA: -- 304.

2 AGENT FLETCHER: Can you spell the
3 last name one more time?

4 MR. DICAPUA: Dicapua, D, as in David.

5 AGENT FLETCHER: Oh, Dicapua?

6 MR. DICAPUA: No, not quite.

7 AGENT FLETCHER: Oh.

8 MR. DICAPUA: D, as in David, I-C, as
9 in cat, A-P, as in Peter, U-A.

10 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you. Got it.
11 Thank you very much.

12 MS. PLOTKIN-MATES: My name is Wendy
13 and then hyphenated Plotkin, P-L-O-T-K-I-N hyphen
14 M-A-T-E-S and I'm in Apartment 510 at James
15 Place. And I also on the paper we have the Power
16 of Attorney that I am signing for and speaking
17 for Lynn Thornton.

18 AGENT FLETCHER: Um-hum.

19 MS. PLOTKIN-MATES: And her name is L-
20 Y-N-N and then T-H-O-R-N-T-O-N and she is
21 Apartment 703.

22 AGENT FLETCHER: And Wendy, may I call

1 you by your first name?

2 MS. PLOTKIN-MATES: Of course.

3 AGENT FLETCHER: So let me ask you
4 something. So you submitted a document to us
5 that you are also representing Lynn Thornton?

6 MS. PLOTKIN-MATES: It's on the second
7 page of the papers.

8 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.

9 MS. PLOTKIN-MATES: And at the bottom
10 that is part of it.

11 AGENT FLETCHER: Does that mean that
12 Mr. Blanchard is not representing you and Lynn?

13 MS. PLOTKIN-MATES: No, no, no. It
14 just means Lynn is out of the country right now.

15 AGENT FLETCHER: Oh, that's okay.
16 Well, okay, that's good and just so that you
17 know, because Lyle Blanchard is here, even
18 without that letter from you, Lyle Blanchard
19 would still be recognized as the designated
20 representative, that's just FYI.

21 MS. PLOTKIN-MATES: Oh, that's --

22 AGENT FLETCHER: So but I did make a

1 note here, Wendy, that you are also representing
2 Lynn Thornton.

3 MS. PLOTKIN-MATES: Thank you. So I
4 just sign --

5 AGENT FLETCHER: Yeah, that's good.

6 MS. PLOTKIN-MATES: -- there now?

7 AGENT FLETCHER: I made a note of it.

8 MS. PLOTKIN-MATES: Okay.

9 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much.

10 MS. CLEEMAN: Good morning. My name
11 is Deborah, D-E-B-O-R-A-H, last name is C-L-E-E-
12 M, as in Mary, A-N, as in Nancy, Apartment 406.
13 I'm also representing my husband, same last name.
14 His first name is James.

15 AGENT FLETCHER: James?

16 MS. CLEEMAN: James.

17 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. And just so
18 you know, Ms. Cleeman, the same thing applies to
19 you.

20 MS. CLEEMAN: Right.

21 AGENT FLETCHER: Lyle Blanchard is
22 recognized as representing the entire group.

1 MS. CLEEMAN: Yes.

2 AGENT FLETCHER: But I have made a
3 note that you are also representing James.

4 MS. CLEEMAN: Thank you.

5 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.

6 MR. BERKLEY: Good morning. Colin
7 Berkley, C-O-L-I-N B-E-R-K-L-E-Y. I'm in Unit
8 410.

9 AGENT FLETCHER: Did you say B, as in
10 boy?

11 MR. BERKLEY: B, as in boy, E, as in
12 echo, R-K-L-E-Y.

13 AGENT FLETCHER: I got it. Thank you.

14 MR. BERKLEY: All right. Thank you.

15 MR. PAGE: Good morning.

16 AGENT FLETCHER: Good morning.

17 MR. PAGE: I'm John Page, that's J-O-
18 H-N P-A-G-E. I'm an owner of Apartment 411.
19 Thank you.

20 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you.

21 MR. HAMILTON: My name is David
22 Hamilton, H-A-M-I-L-T-O-N, and I'm the owner of

1 Apartment 503 James Place.

2 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr.

3 Hamilton. Good morning.

4 MS. GRUCHALSKA: Good morning. So I'm

5 Goanna Gruchalska. It's spelled G-O-A-N-N-A and

6 last name is G, like George, R, like Robert, O,

7 Olive --

8 AGENT FLETCHER: Excuse me, Goanna.

9 That was G like what?

10 MR. GRUCHALSKA: George.

11 AGENT FLETCHER: And what else?

12 MR. GRUCHALSKA: R, like Robert.

13 AGENT FLETCHER: Uh-huh.

14 MR. GRUCHALSKA: O, Olive, C, like

15 Charles, H, like home, A, alpha, L, lima, S, Sam,

16 K, kiwi, A, alpha.

17 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you.

18 MR. GRUCHALSKA: Thank you. Long

19 name.

20 AGENT FLETCHER: Good morning.

21 MS. BANKS: My name is Michele Banks,

22 that's M-I-C-H-E-L-E last name B-A-N-K-S.

1 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much.

2 MS. SANTOS-BURGOA: My name is Maite
3 Santos-Burgoa, M-A-I-T-E S-A-N-T-O-S.

4 AGENT FLETCHER: S-A-M?

5 MS. SANTOS-BURGOA: S-A-N, as in
6 Norman.

7 AGENT FLETCHER: Uh-huh.

8 MS. SANTOS-BURGOA: S-A-N-T-O-S hyphen
9 B-U-R-G-O-A.

10 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you.

11 MR. MATES: Good morning.

12 AGENT FLETCHER: Good morning.

13 MR. MATES: My first name is Amnon.

14 It's spelled A, for apple, M, for Mary, N, for
15 Nancy, O-N, for Nancy. The last name is Mates,
16 M, for Mary, A, for apple, T, for Tom, E, for
17 Edward, S, for Sam.

18 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much.
19 Everyone that just -- is there someone else? Oh,
20 we have a couple more people.

21 MR. BLANCHARD: We have -- now, that's
22 the group. And now we have the abutting owners.

1 AGENT FLETCHER: That's going to be my
2 next question. Thank you very much.

3 MS. COOK: Good morning. My name is
4 Jeanette Cook. It's J-E-A-N-E-T-T-E initial R.
5 C-O-O-K.

6 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you, Ms. Cook.

7 MS. COOK: Okay.

8 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.
9 And what's your Apartment number? What's your
10 unit number?

11 MS. COOK: Excuse me?

12 MR. BLANCHARD: She asked your unit
13 number.

14 MS. COOK: Oh, my number, phone
15 number?

16 AGENT FLETCHER: Your unit number.

17 MS. COOK: 214, sorry.

18 AGENT FLETCHER: 214? Number 214?

19 MR. BLANCHARD: Yes.

20 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.

21 MR. COOK: My name is Robert Cook, R-
22 O-B-E-R-T last name C-O-O-K and it's Apartment

1 No. 214.

2 AGENT FLETCHER: Apartment No. 214.

3 Thank you very much, Mr. Cook.

4 MS. KAVRUS-HOFFMANN: Good morning.

5 AGENT FLETCHER: Good morning.

6 MS. KAVRUS-HOFFMANN: My name is
7 Nadezhda Kavrus-Hoffmann. First name N, like in
8 Nancy, A, like in apple, D, like in David, E,
9 like in eagle, Z, like in zebra, H-D, like in
10 David, A, like in apple. Last name K, like kite,
11 A, like in apple, V, like in Victor, R-U-S dash
12 Hoffmann, H-O-F-F-M-A-N-N, Apartment 210.

13 AGENT FLETCHER: Apartment No. 201?

14 MS. KAVRUS-HOFFMANN: 210.

15 AGENT FLETCHER: Um-hum, yes.

16 MS. KAVRUS-HOFFMANN: I also represent
17 my husband Erik Hoffmann, who is handicapped and
18 disabled and combined he couldn't come.

19 AGENT FLETCHER: Is his first name
20 spelled E-R-I?

21 MS. KAVRUS-HOFFMANN: E-R-I-K.

22 AGENT FLETCHER: E-R-I-K.

1 MS. KAVRUS-HOFFMANN: Hoffmann, H-O-F-
2 F-M-A-N-N.

3 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you, Ms.
4 Hoffmann.

5 MS. KAVRUS-HOFFMANN: Thank you.

6 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. And what's
7 your unit number? His unit number is also 210?

8 MS. KAVRUS-HOFFMANN: Both are 210.

9 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you very
10 much.

11 MR. BUFFIN: Good morning. My name is
12 Kenneth Buffin, K-E-N-N-E-T-H last name Buffin,
13 B, as in boy, U-F-F, as in Frank, I-N, Buffin.

14 AGENT FLETCHER: Mr. Buffin --

15 MR. BUFFIN: My address is Unit 209.

16 AGENT FLETCHER: -- Unit No. 209?

17 MR. BUFFIN: 209.

18 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.

19 MR. BUFFIN: I also represent my wife,
20 who is not here.

21 AGENT FLETCHER: Um-hum.

22 MR. BUFFIN: Her name is Lau Chan

1 spelled L-A-U C-H-A-N.

2 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you very much.

3 MR. BUFFIN: Thank you.

4 AGENT FLETCHER: And her unit number
5 is also 209?

6 MR. BUFFIN: Yes, that is correct,
7 209.

8 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you. Any other
9 abutting property owners?

10 MR. BLANCHARD: Not today.

11 AGENT FLETCHER: Not today. I count
12 seven abutting property owners. I have:
13 Jeanette Cook in Unit 214, Robert Cook in Unit
14 214, Nadezhda, does that sound familiar to
15 anybody, last name spelled Kazruf?

16 MS. KAVRUS-HOFFMANN: K-A-V-R-U-S.

17 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.

18 MR. BLANCHARD: That's her.

19 AGENT FLETCHER: Yes, thank you.

20 MS. KAVRUS-HOFFMANN: Hoffmann.

21 AGENT FLETCHER: And Erik Hoffmann.

22 Okay. So that's -- and then I have Kenneth

1 Buffin and representing also your wife, Lau Chan.

2 So I count six abutting property
3 owners. And so the names that I just called, you
4 are the only individuals present today claiming
5 to be abutting property owners? Is there anyone
6 else here claiming today to be abutting property
7 owners? Okay. Thank you.

8 MR. BLANCHARD: Ms. Fletcher, there is
9 one more that submitted a letter, but he is not
10 present today.

11 AGENT FLETCHER: And what's his name?

12 MR. BLANCHARD: I'm going to ask him
13 to be at the Status Hearing. His name is Jeremy,
14 J -- well, I don't need to spell it, but I do
15 represent him as well, Jeremy Sina, S-I-N-A.

16 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.

17 For each of the protestants claiming to be
18 abutting property owners, do your properties
19 actually touch the property of goPuff?

20 Do the units touch? I'll tell you why
21 I'm asking. Because in order to be an abutting
22 property owner, the units have to touch either by

1 ceiling, wall, they need to touch. And in some
2 protest letters that was mentioned and others it
3 was not.

4 So I'm going to -- Ms. Cook, you can
5 just say yes or no. You are in Unit 214?

6 MS. COOK: Yes.

7 AGENT FLETCHER: Does your unit touch
8 that of the applicant by ceiling, wall?

9 MS. COOK: (No audible answer.)

10 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. So Ms. Cook
11 says yes. The same for Robert Cook, yes?

12 MR. COOK: Yes.

13 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you. And for
14 Ms. Hoffmann, you live in Unit 210. Can you just
15 say yes or no whether or not your unit touches
16 the unit of goPuff by ceiling, wall, if the units
17 touch at all?

18 MS. KAVRUS-HOFFMANN: Yes.

19 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. And that's Ms.
20 Hoffmann saying yes. Ms. Hoffmann, you are in
21 Unit 210 representing Erik Hoffmann, who is also
22 in Unit 210.

1 And, Mr. Buffin, you are in Unit 209?

2 MR. BUFFIN: Yes.

3 AGENT FLETCHER: If you could just say
4 yes or no whether or not your property touches
5 that of goPuff by ceiling, wall, if the units
6 touch in any way?

7 MR. BUFFIN: Yes.

8 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you very
9 much. And that also applies to Lau Chan?

10 MR. BUFFIN: Yes.

11 AGENT FLETCHER: Mr. Blanchard, at
12 this moment do you know whether or not the same
13 thing applies to Jeremy, whether or not his unit
14 actually touches the property of the applicant by
15 ceiling or wall?

16 MR. BLANCHARD: Ms. Fletcher, I
17 understand it does and Mr. Crimmins is here who
18 can attest to it.

19 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.

20 MR. CRIMMINS: I have lived in the
21 building over 30 years, Ms. Fletcher, and I can
22 attest that Units 209, 210, 211, 212 and 214 are

1 the five units that touch and that their floors
2 touch the ceiling of the top space, so that would
3 include the ones we have today 209, 210 and 214.

4 AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.

5 MR. CRIMMINS: And then Mr. Sina in
6 211.

7 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you very
8 much for that. I have a question for the
9 applicant. Would you agree with that, Mr.
10 O'Brien, or do you know already whether or not
11 that is the case that those property actually
12 abut?

13 MR. O'BRIEN: We don't disagree with
14 it at this time.

15 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. So what --

16 MR. O'BRIEN: We don't have
17 independent knowledge.

18 AGENT FLETCHER: -- I'm going to --
19 okay. Thank you. So what that means for today,
20 I'm going to grant standing to each of you as
21 abutting property owners. Each of you present
22 today standing will be granted to you as abutting

1 property owners. And you will need to -- well,
2 let me ask -- let me clarify something first of
3 all.

4 Mr. Blanchard, you are representing
5 the abutting property owners as well as the Group
6 of 33?

7 MR. BLANCHARD: That is correct.

8 AGENT FLETCHER: So what that means is
9 at the upcoming Status Hearing, the abutting
10 property owners do not need to come, so long as
11 Mr. Blanchard comes, because you are here today.
12 So you won't need to come to the Status Hearing.

13 At the Status Hearing, the ABC Board
14 will just want to know the status of the case,
15 that's it. There aren't going to be any
16 decisions made, so you can come if you want to,
17 but so long as Mr. Blanchard comes, you are
18 accounted for.

19 For any abutting property owners that
20 are not present today, that person or persons
21 will need to appear for the Status Hearing,
22 because the ABC Board needs to see the faces of

1 those people.

2 MR. BLANCHARD: We understand.

3 AGENT FLETCHER: By the fact that Mr.
4 Blanchard is here today, they are represented,
5 but they will need to appear in person at the
6 Status Hearing.

7 For the -- for everyone else, you
8 filed your protest only as protestants and not
9 abutting property owners. Is that correct for
10 everybody?

11 MR. BLANCHARD: Yes.

12 AGENT FLETCHER: So that's a yes from
13 everybody. Okay. Thank you.

14 For the Group of 33, because more of
15 you -- because more than five of you -- because
16 at least five of you were present today, the
17 entire group is granted standing as protestants,
18 that's for the Group of 33.

19 The same thing applies to the
20 individual protestants part of the Group of 33,
21 because Mr. Blanchard is here today, you do not
22 need to come back for the Status Hearing unless

1 you want to. So Mr. Blanchard is the only person
2 that needs to be present for the upcoming Status
3 Hearing, but you are welcome to come back if you
4 want.

5 Now, we will go to the Citizens
6 Association of Georgetown. So who is present on
7 behalf of the citizens association?

8 MS. TAMMANY-CRUSE: I'm Karen Tammany-
9 Cruse representing the Citizens Association and
10 the ANC-2E. T-A-M-M-A-N-Y C-R-U-S-E.

11 AGENT FLETCHER: Thank you, Ms. Cruse.
12 ANC-2E and the Citizens Association of Georgetown
13 have standing as protestants.

14 Just for the record, Ms. Cruse, I'll
15 ask you a question and that is that the applicant
16 was aware of a meeting that you held regarding
17 the resolution to protest the application. That
18 seven day notice?

19 MS. TAMMANY-CRUSE: Yes, yes, yes.

20 AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. Okay. Thank
21 you. Mr. O'Brien, are you -- would you disagree
22 with that?

1 MR. O'BRIEN: I do not disagree with
2 that.

3 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.
4 That's just for the record. Thank you.

5 The Citizens Association does have
6 standing as a protestant.

7 We need to set a date for a mediation,
8 a Status Hearing and a Protest Hearing. I'll
9 give you the date for the Status and Protest
10 Hearing first.

11 The date for the Status Hearing is
12 February 27, 2019 at 9:30.

13 The Protest Hearing is set for March
14 13, 2019 at 4:30.

15 We need to set a date for mediation.
16 I'll give you the next available date. The next
17 available day is Tuesday, February the 5th, that's
18 the next available date.

19 MR. O'BRIEN: I know that is a bad
20 date for me as is the 6th.

21 MR. BLANCHARD: That date is a bad
22 date for me as well. I'll actually be out of the

1 country --

2 AGENT FLETCHER: Um-hum.

3 MR. BLANCHARD: -- until the
4 President's Day the 18th.

5 AGENT FLETCHER: Okay.

6 MR. BLANCHARD: So that's a bad date.

7 AGENT FLETCHER: Yes. We can do the
8 19th or the 21st of February. The 19th or the 21st?

9 MR. O'BRIEN: What day of the week are
10 those?

11 AGENT FLETCHER: That's Tuesday and
12 Thursday.

13 MS. TAMMANY-CRUSE: Thursday would be
14 better for me.

15 AGENT FLETCHER: Tuesday is better for
16 CAG.

17 MR. O'BRIEN: Tuesday is better for
18 me.

19 MS. TAMMANY-CRUSE: Thursday, I said
20 is better.

21 AGENT FLETCHER: Mr. Blanchard, what
22 do you think?

1 MR. BLANCHARD: Well, considering jet
2 lag since I'll be across the world --

3 AGENT FLETCHER: Yes.

4 MR. BLANCHARD: -- is the mediation
5 the 21st?

6 AGENT FLETCHER: It can be in the
7 morning or the afternoon. It can be 9:00, 10:00,
8 11:00, 12:00, 1:00.

9 MR. BLANCHARD: I prefer the morning.

10 MR. O'BRIEN: And that's not going to
11 work for us because Mr. Maloumian comes down from
12 Philadelphia before this, yeah, so afternoon
13 would be better for us.

14 AGENT FLETCHER: So if say 1:00 or
15 2:00 doesn't work, we can -- I'll look at the
16 Thursday, the 21st. Mr. Blanchard, that would be
17 better?

18 MR. BLANCHARD: That would be better
19 for me.

20 AGENT FLETCHER: Would that work?

21 MR. O'BRIEN: The 21st?

22 AGENT FLETCHER: Um-hum.
